**RETRIEVER UPDATE:** UMBC got off to a 1-0 start with a 72-50 win over Morgan State for the first time since the 2002-03 season, head coach Phil Stern's first year with the Retrievers. That year UMBC defeated Towson on the road in the season opener. That same year was also the last time UMBC won its home opener with the Retrievers defeating Morgan State after Towson to start 2-0. UMBC was led by a number of role players, including Matea Pender's 13 points, Brittnie Hughes' 11 points and four assists and six blocks by Amanda Robinson. Morgan Hatten gave UMBC strong minutes off the bench with nine points as UMBC tallied 26 bench points in the contest. UMBC shot 42.4 percent and held Morgan State 0-for-10 outside the arc in the game.

**KNIGHTS' UPDATE:** The Fairleigh Dickinson Knights defeated Columbia by a final margin of 84-70 on Saturday. Megan Kirkland led the way with 15 points and 13 rebounds while four Knights scored in double-digits. Rachel Ormsby and Katie Warehime came off the bench to score 15 points and 14 points, respectively. Mercedes Walker had six blocks which should make a good match-up with UMBC center Amanda Robinson, who also had six blocks on Saturday.

**Who's Up Next:** UMBC travels to Tampa, Fla., for the Best Western Round Ball Classic at the University of South Florida. The tournament features UMBC, South Florida, Robert Morris and Loyola (Ill.).

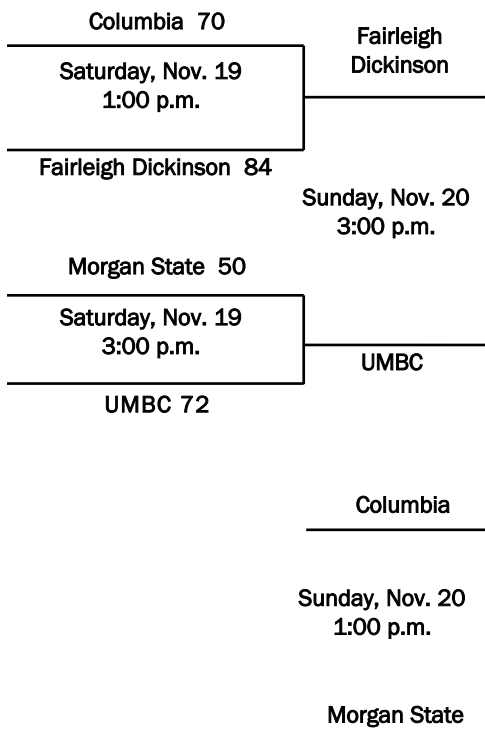

## Third Annual UMBC Retriever Tip-Off Tournament Saturday, Nov. 19-Sunday, Nov. 20



*Scouting Morgan State...* First-year head coach Donald Beasley and Morgan State were picked to finish 11th in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference preseason poll. Last year the Lady Bears finished last (11th-place) in the conference with a 4-23 overall record and 2-16 league mark. The Lady Bears, who defeated Bethune-Cookman twice last season for their lone conference wins return eight letterwinners, including two starters in junior guard Whitney Johnson (9.2 points, which ranked 19th in the MEAC, 2.5 rebounds) and sophomore center Britney Griffin (4.2 ppg, 4.7 rpg). Also returning for Morgan State are juniors Sarissa Gaskins (5-11, G/F, 4.2 ppg, 2.4 rpg), Latricia Jones (6-2, F/C, 5.3 ppg, 6.5 rpg) and Robyn Munford (5-6, G, 2.2 ppg, 1.5 rpg). Jennyffer Vargas, a 6-1 forward from Miami, Fla., also returns to the Lady Bears after missing the 2004-05 season due to an injury. Vargas averaged 5.7 points and 5.6 rebounds a game during her sophomore season.

*Scouting Columbia...* Columbia enters the season with a young squad, featuring one senior and three juniors on its roster. The Lions return this season with just one starter returning and seven letterwinners coming back after a 12-15 season last year. Susan Kern and Adia Revell both graduated after leading the team in scoring at 10.5 and 9.5 ppg, respectively. Junior Megan Griffith is first-year head coach Paul Nixon's top returning player. Griffith started all 27 games last year, averaging 32.0 minutes per game and 7.9 ppg. Griffith ranked third on the team in scoring at 7.9 ppg and led the team in assists with 3.5 per game. She ranked sixth in the Ivy League in assists, second in free throw percentage (.875) and 14th in steals. The Lions last season went 5-9 in the Ivy League, finishing tied for fifth in the conference standings.

*Scouting Fairleigh Dickinson...* FDU lost three starters from a squad that went 2-25 last year and 1-17 in the Northeast Conference as Erin Mills, Kaneshia Wright and Kay Odenwaelder will not be back this season. Odenwaelder and Mills were also the team's leading scorers the last two seasons. The emergence of all-rookie team center Jennifer Walkling in 2004-05 may have foreshadowed a bright future for the Knights. Walkling ranked 12th in the NEC in field-goal percentage last season (44.6) and started the last 12 games for FDU. Senior Krissy Suckow (pictured) (8.7) is the team's second-leading scorer behind Walkling and will need to step up her offense due to the loss of Odenwaelder and Mills. Eight freshmen newcomers will most likely determine FDU's fate for the season. Interestingly, Head Coach Sandy Gordon Gaglioti signed the Coombs' triplets (Ashley, Heather, Lauren) from Trumbell, CT.

Head Women's Basketball Coach Phil Stern is in his fourth season with the Retrievers and 10th season as a collegiate head women's basketball coach. Amongst the many accolades in Stern's file are the WBCA District III Coach of the Year and the Peach Belt Conference Coach of the Year award he received after taking a 5-22 squad three years later to the NCAA Division II Tournament. Stern almost had the same success with UMBC. In his first year with the Retrievers, who missed the conference tournament the prior year, Stern took UMBC to a game away from the NCAA Division I Tournament as they reached the NEC title game. Stern is looking to continue the revitalization of the Retrievers as they continue to grow in the mid-major America East Conference.

# Retriever Quick Shots ...

- Coach Phil Stern used 11 different players in the opener by the 10:23 mark in the first half. UMBC played all 13 available players in the game.
- UMBC tallied 24 assists in the game, one more assist than the team's single-game best a year ago when the Retrievers tallied 23 assists against Lafayette. UMBC last season led the league in assists at 15.0 per game. The Retrievers' single-game mark for assists is 27.
- Amanda Robinson's six blocks tied Eunice French for the most blocks recorded in a single game by a Retriever. Robinson had three blocks in the first five minutes against Morgan State.
- UMBC as a team blocked nine shots in the game, with Nicole Dixon recording two and Mackenzie Butler one.
- UMBC did not have one player of 30 minutes in the opener. In 14 out of the final 18 games last season, at least one player on the Retriever squad played all-40 minutes. **Sharri Rohde** leads UMBC with 11 40-minute nights in her career while **Brittanie Hughes** has logged all the minutes on the court on seven occasions.

- Senior **Matea Pender** ranked third in the nation at the end of last year with a 48.8 percent three-point field goal percentage.

- **Matea Pender** was named to the America East All-Third team at the end of last season.

- **Matea Pender** posted the third largest points per game increase last season in Division I with an 11.8 ppg increase. Pender averaged 1.5 ppg in 2003-04 and 13.3 ppg in 2004-05.

## News and Notes...

**UMBC Reaches First Title Game in Home Tournament...**UMBC will open the season with its own home tournament for the third consecutive year and with its win over Morgan State reaches the championship game for the first time. The Retriever Tip-Off Tournament presented by Close Call America features Morgan State, Columbia, Fairleigh Dickinson and host UMBC. Last year UMBC finished third, falling to Coppin State in the opener and defeating Mount St. Mary's in the consolation game. In the first year of the tournament UMBC lost both games and finished fourth.

**For Starters...**UMBC opened with a win for the first time since the 2002-03 season at Towson, head coach Phil Stern's first season. UMBC's last home opener win came that same year in Stern's second game at the Retriever helm, leading UMBC past 2005-06 opening opponent Morgan State, 57-34.

**Pender's Lead...**Last season in UMBC's eight wins Matea Pender average 19.0 ppg, shooting 52.9 percent from the field (55-of-99) and 65.9 percent from three-point range (29-of-44). In four of the eight games Pender scored 20 or more points.

**UMBC To Meet One of Two Possible NEC Foes ...**Two of UMBC's former foes in the Northeast Conference could reacquire themselves with the Retrievers this season. Fairleigh Dickinson and Robert Morris are in opposite brackets for both tournaments UMBC will be playing in this season. FDU defeated Columbia in the opening round of the Retriever Tip-Off Tournament presented by Close Call America and will meet UMBC on Sunday, Nov. 20. Robert Morris takes on Loyola (Ill.) at the South Florida Best Western Roundball Classic with a chance to face UMBC on Sunday, Nov. 27.

**UMBC Adds Two Non-Conference Games In 2005-06...**With Northeastern having moved to the Colonial Athletic Conference, UMBC will play two less conference games and added two non-conference games to the 2005-06 schedule. UMBC will play 16 conference games, eight home and eight away, and face 11 non-conference opponents, leading up to the America East Tournament.

**America East Tournament Returns To Hartford...**For the third consecutive season the America East Conference Championships will return to Chase Arena at the Reich Family Pavilion on the campus of the University of Hartford. Hartford has hosted the conference tournament the past two seasons, including winning the league tournament last season.

**International Students...**UMBC has developed a reputation for having international students on its roster, including two in 2005-06. UMBC has graduated two international students the last two years and will graduate senior Matea Pender at the conclusion of the upcoming season.

**Hitting the Airwaves...**UMBC will hit the airwaves with six games broadcasted live on WLJG-1370 AM, all home games and some away games via www.umbcretreivers.com and a televised game against Vermont on Feb. 12 at RAC Arena.
