RETRIEVER UPDATE: UMBC lost its season opener for the third time in four years with a 72-58 defeat at the hands of nationally ranked George Washington on Nov. 10. Three Retrievers scored in double figures, led by senior point guard **Brittnie Hughes'** 13 points, six assists and five steals, along with 12 points, nine rebounds and three blocks from senior forward **Sharri Rohde**. Junior guard **Kristin Drabyn** also contributed 12 points. UMBC sunk 10 three-pointers in the game, including seven of 11 in the second half, and shot 58.8 percent from long distance

EAGLE UPDATE: The Coppin State Eagles were tabbed the preseason favorite to win the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference. The two-time defending MEAC champions, the Eagles return four starters and 10 letterwinners from a team that finished 22-9 last season, including 18-0 in league play, and advanced to the NCAA Tournament with a nation's-best 21-game win streak, which ended with a first-round loss to second-seeded Connecticut. The Eagles opened the season with a 63-53 loss at George Washington. Senior guard Rashida Suber led the team with 16 points. Suber, the 2006 MEAC Tournament Outstanding Performer, was named the MEAC Preseason Player of the Year after earning an All-MEAC first-team selection last year. Junior guard Shalamar Oakley was tabbed to the All-MEAC Preseason Second Team. Head Coach Derek Brown returns after earning 2006 MEAC Coach of the Year.

Who's Up Next: UMBC will host its second consecutive Baltimore rival when the Loyola Greyhounds visit the RAC Arena on Friday, Nov. 17 at 7 p.m.

Head Women's Basketball Coach Phil Stern is in his fifth season with the Retrievers and 11th season as a collegiate head women's basketball coach. Among the many accolades in Stern's file are the 2001-02 WBCA District III Coach of the Year and Peach Belt Conference Coach of the Year, which he received after taking a USC Aiken squad that finished 5-22 in 1999 to the NCAA Division II Tournament three years later. Stern almost had the same success with UMBC. In his first year with the Retrievers, who missed the Northeast Conference tournament the prior year, Stern took UMBC to the NEC title game. Stern is looking to continue the revitalization of the Retrievers as they continue to grow in the mid-major America East Conference. In 2005-06, he led UMBC to its first winning season since 1993-94 with a 15-13 record, turning around a team that finished 8-20 the year before.

Retriever Uprising

Head coach **Phil Stern** continues to build the UMBC women's basketball program towards the top of the America East Conference. With 15 wins in 2005-06, the Retrievers surpassed their win total from the previous year for the second consecutive season. Below are current notes on UMBC's growth last season.

- UMBC's 15 wins were seven more than its 2004-05 record of 8-20 (UMBC recorded four wins in 2003-04).
- UMBC's 15 wins secured the Retrievers' first .500 season since going 15-13 in 1993-94.
- UMBC's 15 wins is the most regular-season wins since winning 17 games during the 1990-91 season.
- UMBC's 15 wins are tied for the second-most wins since the Retrievers turned Division-I in 1986-87. UMBC's top seasons came in 1990-91 (17 wins), 1986-87 (15) and 1993-94 (15).

- UMBC's six-game win streak (ended Feb. 14, 2006), was the longest since joining the America East Conference.
- The last time UMBC won six games in a row was during the 1993-94 season in which UMBC set a school record with 10 consecutive wins.
- Over the last two years UMBC has recorded its best starts since joining Division-I, last year opening the season 6-1.
- UMBC's seven conference wins is the Retrievers' most wins in the league, topping the four-win mark set in 2003-04.
- UMBC went 9-3 at home, the best mark since going 10-0 in 1993-94.
- UMBC was picked to finish ninth in the conference standings in the preseason coaches' poll, but finished fifth, making the biggest jump from the preseason predictions. Stony Brook made the next-biggest jump, from fifth to second.
- UMBC's success came as the America East Conference was ranked 11th in the RPI poll.

RETRIEVER QUICK SHOTS...

- Three Retrievers scored in double figures in the season opener at George Washington, led by senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes'** 13. Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** and junior guard **Kristin Drabyn** added 12 points apiece.
- UMBC trailed 16-10 six minutes into the game but rattled off seven straight points to take a 17-16 lead with 9:26 to go in the first half. **Brittanie Hughes** hit two free throws to put the Retrievers on top.
- After taking the lead, UMBC was out-scored 22-5 over the final 9:26 of the first half and trailed 37-22 at halftime.
- The Colonials led by 18 three times, the last with six minutes remaining in the game, but UMBC pulled to within 10 at 61-51 with four minutes to go, the closest the Retrievers would get in the second half.
- **Brittanie Hughes** had a game-high six assists and was 3-for-5 from beyond the arc.
- **Sharri Rohde** scored 11 of her 12 points in the second half. She also posted a game-high nine rebounds and three blocks.
- The Retrievers sunk 10 three-pointers in the game, including seven of 11 in the second half, and shot 58.8 percent from long distance. But UMBC shot just 43.8 percent from the floor on the game.
- Senior co-captain **Sharri Rohde** was selected to the America East all-conference second team last season.
- **Sharri Rohde** enters the season with 84 consecutive starts and has not missed a start in her entire college career. She ranks seventh all-time at UMBC in games started.
- UMBC ranked second in the America East in scoring defense last season, allowing only 58.6 points per game.
- UMBC ranked third in the conference in field goal percentage last season, shooting at a .434 clip, and ranked second in three-point field goal percentage at .348.
- UMBC led the America East and ranked 22nd nationally with 16.43 assists per game last season, nearly three more dishes per contest than their closest competition (Binghamton, 13.83). UMBC also led the America East in assist-to-turnover ratio at 1.03. Senior co-captain **Brittanie Hughes** ranked second in the America East with 4.21 assists per game.
- Junior **Kristin Drabyn** ranked fourth in the conference in three-point field goal percentage at 40.6 percent.

News and Notes...

UMBC Picked Sixth in Preseason Poll: The Retrievers were selected to finish sixth in the America East in a vote of the conference's head coaches, the program's highest preseason billing since joining the America East in 2003. In a crowded middle-third of the conference, UMBC is just four points out of fourth place.

For Starters: UMBC opened the season with a loss for the third time in four years. Last season was the exception, as the Retrievers defeated Morgan State, 72-50, at the UMBC Tip-Off Tournament. UMBC is looking to win its home opener for the second year in a row tonight.

Battle of Baltimore: Starting with tonight's game against Coppin State, UMBC will host three teams who make their homes in the Baltimore area, with two of the game televised regionally on the Mid-Atlantic Sports Network. The Retrievers will also face Loyola on Nov. 17 and Towson on Nov. 21.

Shall We Dance: UMBC will take on three teams that earned NCAA Tournament berths last season. The Retrievers faced a George Washington team in the season opener which earned a No. 7 seed in the Cleveland regional and defeated 10th-seeded Old Dominion before falling to second-seeded Tennessee in the second round. In addition, Coppin State, was seeded 15th in the Bridgeport regional as the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference champion and lost to second-seeded Connecticut in the first round. America East champion Hartford, which upset sixth-seeded Temple in the first round as the No. 11 seed in the Bridgeport regional before falling to third-seeded Georgia in the second round, will host the Retrievers on Jan. 17 and come to the RAC on March 3 for the season finale.

Going Up: One of the league's most improved teams last season, UMBC was picked ninth in the 2005 preseason poll after finishing the 2003-04 campaign with an 8-20 overall record and a 3-15 conference mark. But the Retrievers rattled off six straight wins over America East foes in early February for a program-best 7-9 fifth-place finish in the conference in 2005-06, and at 15-13 overall posted the team's first winning record since 1993-94.

Streaky Retrievers: UMBC opened the 2005-06 season winning eight of its first 11 games for the program's best start since 1985-86 and its best start ever since becoming Division-I. But the Retrievers dropped the first five games on their America East Conference schedule to start the new year before a 48-41 win over Albany on Jan. 26 snapped the skid. With that victory, UMBC went on to win six in a row with wins over league rivals Albany, Stony Brook, Binghamton, Boston University, New Hampshire and Vermont. A loss to eventual conference champion Hartford - the only

America East opponent which the Retrievers did not beat during the season - on Feb. 15 snapped the streak, and UMBC lost five of their final six games to end the season.

Rohde Earns Second-Team All-Conference: Forward **Sharri Rohde** was selected to the 2006 America East All-Conference Second Team. She led UMBC with 5.8 rebounds per game and ranked second with 12.4 points per game.

Lending a Helping Hand: UMBC led the America East Conference for the second consecutive season in assists per game and ranked 22nd in the NCAA. The Retrievers recorded 16.43 apg and had seven games with 20-plus assists on the season, including 26 against Fairleigh Dickinson, one short of the single-season school mark of 27, set in 1985 against Shippensburg. **Brittnie Hughes** dished out a career-high 10 assists against Lafayette and averaged 4.21 apg on the season, ranking second in the league. The point guard dished out 118 assists on the year, a career best and eighth-most in a single season in school history.

Rohde Joins Top-20 On All-Time Scoring Charts: **Sharri Rohde** moved into the top-20 on UMBC's all-time scoring charts and enters the 2006-07 season ranking 19th all-time with 783 career points. Rohde, who tallied her best year to date with 348 points in 2005-06, is in position to become the 15th player in UMBC history to score 1,000 career points.

Pender Out, Drabyn In: Junior **Kristin Drabyn** moves into the shooting guard position, taking over for the graduated Matea Pender, the team's leading scorer last season with 12.6 points per game. Pender is UMBC's all-time leader in three-point field goal percentage at .412, but Drabyn was nearly as good last season, shooting at a .406 clip from outside the arc while Pender hit 40.8 percent of her three-point shots. The duo ranked third and fourth in the America East.

America East Ranked 11th in RPI Poll: America East ranked 11th in The Collegiate Basketball News Women's RPI Report, the highest the conference has ever finished. America East boasted three teams with RPIs in the top 100. Hartford led the conference with an RPI of 28, followed by Stony Brook (46) and Boston University (80). UMBC finished with an RPI of 176, sixth-best in the conference.

Rohde's Start Streak: Senior **Sharri Rohde** started all 28 games last season for the third year in a row. With a start in the season opener, she extended her start streak to 85 games and is tied for seventh all-time at UMBC for career starts.

Retrievers Fall in Quarterfinals: Fifth-seeded UMBC lost in overtime to No. 4 Binghamton, 72-66, in the quarterfinals of the 2006 America East Tournament. **Sharri Rohde** tallied 14 points in the loss, followed by **Brittnie Hughes** and Matea Pender with 13 apiece.
