RETRIEVER UPDATE: UMBC has lost its first two games for the first time since the 2003-04 campaign, when the Retrievers opened the season with 16 straight defeats. UMBC is coming off a poor shooting performance in its home opener, a 59-48 loss to Coppin State, in which the Retrievers shot just 35.9 percent from the floor. Freshman guard **Carlee Cassidy** led the team with 17 points off the bench, including 10 in the first half to give the Retrievers an early 19-14 lead. She shot 6-for-11 from the field, including 3-for-5 from long distance. Senior point guard **Brittnie Hughes** added 11 points, while senior forward **Sharri Rohde** posted nine points and a team-high 10 rebounds.

GREYHOUND UPDATE: The Loyola Greyhounds were selected to finish seventh in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference preseason poll after placing third last season with a 20-10 overall record and a 13-5 league mark. Loyola lost to Marist in the finals of the MAAC Tournament. Senior Brittany Dunn was named to the preseason All-MAAC second team. The Greyhounds are 1-1 on the season and coming off a 66-57 win over Drexel on Nov. 12. Four players scored in double figures, led by Dunn and Jill Glessner with 17 points each. Tynisha Davis added 15 points, while Meghan Wood scored 10. The quartet has accounted for 85 percent of the team's total scoring.

Who's Up Next: UMBC will host its third consecutive Baltimore rival when the Towson Tigers visit the RAC Arena on Tuesday, Nov. 21 at 5 p.m.

Head Women's Basketball Coach Phil Stern is in his fifth season with the Retrievers and 11th season as a collegiate head women's basketball coach. Among the many accolades in Stern's file are the 2001-02 WBCA District III Coach of the Year and Peach Belt Conference Coach of the Year, which he received after taking a USC Aiken squad that finished 5-22 in 1999 to the NCAA Division II Tournament three years later. Stern almost had the same success with UMBC. In his first year with the Retrievers, who missed the Northeast Conference tournament the prior year, Stern took UMBC to the NEC title game. Stern is looking to continue the revitalization of the Retrievers as they continue to grow in the mid-major America East Conference. In 2005-06, he led UMBC to its first winning season since 1993-94 with a 15-13 record, turning around a team that finished 8-20 the year before.

Retriever Uprising

Head coach **Phil Stern** continues to build the UMBC women's basketball program towards the top of the America East Conference. With 15 wins in 2005-06, the Retrievers surpassed their win total from the previous year for the second consecutive season. Below are current notes on UMBC's growth last season.
 - UMBC's 15 wins were seven more than its 2004-05 record of 8-20 (UMBC recorded four wins in 2003-04).
 - UMBC's 15 wins secured the Retrievers' first .500 season since going 15-13 in 1993-94.
 - UMBC's 15 wins is the most regular-season wins since winning 17 games during the 1990-91 season.
 - UMBC's 15 wins are tied for the second-most wins since the Retrievers turned Division-I in 1986-87. UMBC's top seasons came in 1990-91 (17 wins), 1986-87 (15) and 1993-94 (15).

- UMBC's six-game win streak (ended Feb. 14, 2006), was the longest since joining the America East Conference.
- The last time UMBC won six games in a row was during the 1993-94 season in which UMBC set a school record with 10 consecutive wins.
- Over the last two years UMBC has recorded its best starts since joining Division-I, last year opening the season 6-1.
- UMBC's seven conference wins is the Retrievers' most wins in the league, topping the four-win mark set in 2003-04.
- UMBC went 9-3 at home, the best mark since going 10-0 in 1993-94.
- UMBC was picked to finish ninth in the conference standings in the preseason coaches' poll, but finished fifth, making the biggest jump from the preseason predictions. Stony Brook made the next-biggest jump, from fifth to second.
- UMBC's success came as the America East Conference was ranked 11th in the RPI poll.

RETRIEVER QUICK SHOTS...

- Freshman guard **Carlee Cassidy** scored 17 points off the bench in the home opener against Coppin State, including 10 in the first half, shooting 6-for-11 from the floor en route to earning UMBC's first Marlowe Sports America East Player of the Game.
- The Eagles took an early 10-6 lead, but the Retrievers went on a 13-4 run with 10 points from Cassidy to jump out in front 19-14 with seven minutes to go. UMBC maintained the lead until Talia Sutton's layup with 21 seconds left in the first half gave Coppin State a 25-24 half-time advantage.
- The Retrievers pulled to within one point with 3:03 remaining in the game, but the Eagles scored the final 10 points of the contest for the 59-48 win.
- Senior point guard **Brittnie Hughes** scored 11 points, giving her double figures for the second straight game.
- Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** posted a team-best 10 rebounds and was just one point shy of a double-double with nine points.
- The Retrievers shot just 35.9 percent from the floor and were out-rebounded, 36-31.
- **Sharri Rohde** has not missed a start in her entire college career for 86 consecutive starts. She ranks sixth all-time at UMBC in games started.
- UMBC leads the America East Conference in three-point field goal percentage, shooting 45.8 percent from beyond the arc, but ranks last in three-point field goal defense, allowing opponents to connect on 54.2 percent from long distance.

News and Notes...

UMBC Picked Sixth in Preseason Poll: The Retrievers were selected to finish sixth in the America East in a vote of the conference's head coaches, the program's highest preseason billing since joining the America East in 2003. In a crowded middle-third of the conference, UMBC is just four points out of fourth place.

For Starters: UMBC has lost its first two games of the season for the first time since 2003-04, when the Retrievers opened the season 0-16.

Battle of Baltimore: Starting with Tuesday night's loss to Coppin State, UMBC will host three teams who make their homes in the Baltimore area, with two of the game televised regionally on the Mid-Atlantic Sports Network. In addition to tonight's game against Loyola, the Retrievers will also face Towson on Nov. 21.

Shall We Dance: UMBC will take on three teams that earned NCAA Tournament berths last season. The Retrievers faced a George Washington team in the season opener which earned a No. 7 seed in the Cleveland regional and defeated 10th-seeded Old Dominion before falling to second-seeded Tennessee in the second round. In addition, Coppin State was seeded 15th in the Bridgeport regional as the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference champion and lost to second-seeded Connecticut in the first round. America East champion Hartford, which upset sixth-seeded Temple in the first round as the No. 11 seed in the Bridgeport regional before falling to third-seeded Georgia in the second round, will host the Retrievers on Jan. 17 and come to the RAC on March 3 for the season finale.

Rohde Hits 800: Sharri Rohde scored her 800th career point in Tuesday's home opener against Coppin State, when she tallied nine points. With a total of 804 points in her career, Rohde ranks 18th all-time in UMBC history. She is in position to become the 15th player in UMBC history to score 1,000 career points.

Retrievers Ink Three in Early Signing Period: Three high school seniors have signed National Letters of Intent to join the Retrievers in the fall of 2007. **Michele Brokans** is a 5-foot-8 point guard out of

Lansdale Catholic in Lansdale, Pa. She has helped her AAU team, FENCOR, to three AAU national championships and five straight appearances in the national championship game. **Meghan Colabella** is a 6-foot forward out of Montclair High school in Montclair, N.J., where she was first-team all-league and second-team all-county. **Chrissy Robinson**, the younger sister of UMBC junior forward **Amanda Robinson**, is a 6-foot-3 post player out of Patuxent High School in Lusby, Md., where she averaged a double-double as a junior.

Going Up: One of the league's most improved teams last season, UMBC was picked ninth in the 2005 preseason poll after finishing the 2003-04 campaign with an 8-20 overall record and a 3-15 conference mark. But the Retrievers rattled off six straight wins over America East foes in early February for a program-best 7-9 fifth-place finish in the conference in 2005-06, and at 15-13 overall posted the team's first winning record since 1993-94.

Rohde's Start Streak: Senior **Sharri Rohde** started all 28 games last season for the third year in a row. With a start in the first two games this season, she extended her start streak to 86 games and is sixth all-time at UMBC for career starts.

One-Two-Three: UMBC leads the America East Conference in three-point field goal percentage, shooting 48.5 percent from beyond the arc, and ranks second in three-pointers made with 8.00 per game. But the Retrievers also rank last in the league in three-point field goal defense, as opponenets are shooting 54.2 percent from long distance.

Rohde Moving Up Assists and Blocks Charts: Senior **Sharri Rohde**, UMBC's active leader in assists, blocks and steals, is moving up the Retrievers' all-time charts in the assists and blocks category. Rohde currently has 247 career assists, tied for eighth all-time, and 67 career blocks, eighth all-time. **Amanda Robinson** ranks 13th with 49 blocks in her career.

Hughes Joins All-Time Assists Chart: Senior **Brittanie Hughes** also ranks among UMBC's all-time top-15 for career assists. The Retriever point guard currently has 227 career assists, ranking 10th all-time.

Streaky Retrievers: UMBC opened the 2005-06 season winning eight of its first 11 games for the program's best start since 1985-86 and its best start ever since becoming Division-I. But the Retrievers dropped the first five games on their America East Conference schedule to start the new year before a 48-41 win over Albany on Jan. 26 snapped the skid. With that victory, UMBC went on to win six in a row with wins over league rivals Albany, Stony Brook, Binghamton, Boston University, New Hampshire and Vermont. A loss to eventual conference champion Hartford - the only America East opponent which the Retrievers did not beat during the season - on Feb. 15 snapped the streak, and UMBC lost five of their final six games to end the season.

Rohde Earns Second-Team All-Conference: Forward **Sharri Rohde** was selected to the 2006 America East All-Conference Second Team. She led UMBC with 5.8 rebounds per game and ranked second with 12.4 points per game.

Lending a Helping Hand: UMBC led the America East Conference for the second consecutive season in assists per game and ranked 22nd in the NCAA. The Retrievers recorded 16.43 apg and had seven games with 20-plus assists on the season, including 26 against Fairleigh Dickinson, one short of the single-season school mark of 27, set in 1985 against Shippensburg. **Brittanie Hughes** dished out a career-high 10 assists against Lafayette and averaged 4.21 apg on the season, ranking second in the league. The point guard dished out 118 assists on the year, a career best and eighth-most in a single season in school history.

America East Ranked 11th in RPI Poll: America East ranked 11th in The Collegiate Basketball News Women's RPI Report, the highest the conference has ever finished. America East boasted three teams with RPIs in the top 100. Hartford led the conference with an RPI of 28, followed by Stony Brook (46) and Boston University (80).

UMBC finished with an RPI of 176, sixth-best in the conference.

Relentless Retrievers: UMBC came from behind in 12 of its 15 wins last season, including three wins after trailing by 10 or more points. The Retrievers overcame a 10-point deficit against Albany, a 16-point deficit against Vermont and a 13-point deficit against Maine in conference games. UMBC also fought back from 13 down against Hartford to send the game to overtime.
