RETRIEVER UPDATE: UMBC is coming off a 50-45 loss to crosstown rival Towson on Tuesday. The Tigers' shot just 29.1 percent from the floor, but the Retrievers' shooting was no better at 31.5 percent. Both teams shot below 30 percent in the first half, but UMBC held a 21-17 lead at halftime. The Retrievers opened the second period on a 12-6 scoring run over the first six and a half minutes of play, sparked by 10 points from junior guard **Kristin Drabyn**. UMBC led, 35-25, with 12:54 to go, but Towson rattled off 17 of the next 22 points to take a 42-40 lead with 3:06 remaining. Drabyn and senior forward **Sharri Rohde** each scored 12 points to lead the Retrievers. Rohde added a team-high eight rebounds, while sophomore center **Mackenzie Butler** had seven. Senior point guard **Brittnie Hughes** was held in double digits for the first time all season, as she scored eight points but added seven assists and four steals.

HIGHLANDER UPDATE: In their first season of NCAA Division-I basketball, the NJIT Highlanders are coming off an 86-54 victory over Wilmington on Tuesday and are 2-2 on the season. Four players scored in double figures, led by freshman Katie Piekieski's career-best 21 points. She leads the team with 18.3 ppg.

Who's Up Next: UMBC hits the road on Nov. 28 to take on local rival American in Washington, D.C., as the Retrievers will play seven of their next eight games away from the RAC Arena.

Head Women's Basketball Coach Phil Stern is in his fifth season with the Retrievers and 11th season as a collegiate head women's basketball coach. Among the many accolades in Stern's file are the 2001-02 WBCA District III Coach of the Year and Peach Belt Conference Coach of the Year, which he received after taking a USC Aiken squad that finished 5-22 in 1999 to the NCAA Division II Tournament three years later. Stern almost had the same success with UMBC. In his first year with the Retrievers, who missed the Northeast Conference tournament the prior year, Stern took UMBC to the NEC title game. Stern is looking to continue the revitalization of the Retrievers as they continue to grow in the mid-major America East Conference. In 2005-06, he led UMBC to its first winning season since 1993-94 with a 15-13 record, turning around a team that finished 8-20 the year before.

Retriever Uprising

Head coach **Phil Stern** continues to build the UMBC women's basketball program towards the top of the America East Conference. With 15 wins in 2005-06, the Retrievers surpassed their win total from the previous year for the second consecutive season. Below are current notes on UMBC's growth last season.

- UMBC's 15 wins were seven more than its 2004-05 record of 8-20 (UMBC recorded four wins in 2003-04).

- UMBC's 15 wins secured the Retrievers' first .500 season since going 15-13 in 1993-94.

- UMBC's 15 wins is the most regular-season wins since winning 17 games during the 1990-91 season.

- UMBC's 15 wins are tied for the second-most wins since the Retrievers turned Division-I in 1986-87. UMBC's top seasons came in 1990-91 (17 wins), 1986-87 (15) and 1993-94 (15).

- UMBC's six-game win streak (ended Feb. 14, 2006), was the longest since joining the America East Conference.

- The last time UMBC won six games in a row was during the 1993-94 season in which UMBC set a school record with 10 consecutive wins.

- Over the last two years UMBC has recorded its best starts since joining Division-I, last year opening the season 6-1.

- UMBC's seven conference wins is the Retrievers' most wins in the league, topping the four-win mark set in 2003-04.

- UMBC went 9-3 at home, the best mark since going 10-0 in 1993-94.

- UMBC was picked to finish ninth in the conference standings in the preseason coaches' poll, but finished fifth, making the biggest jump from the preseason predictions. Stony Brook made the next-biggest jump, from fifth to second.

- UMBC's success came as the America East Conference was ranked 11th in the RPI poll.

RETRIEVER QUICK SHOTS...

- Senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes** has played all 40 minutes in three games this season.
- **Sharri Rohde** has not missed a start in her entire college career for 88 consecutive starts. She ranks sixth all-time at UMBC in games started.
- UMBC leads the America East Conference in three-point field goal percentage, shooting 42.0 percent from beyond the arc, and in three-pointers made with 6.50 per game, but ranks 7th in three-point field goal defense, allowing opponents to connect on 35.7 percent from long distance.

News and Notes...

UMBC Picked Sixth in Preseason Poll: The Retrievers were selected to finish sixth in the America East in a vote of the conference's head coaches, the program's highest preseason billing since joining the America East in 2003. In a crowded middle-third of the conference, UMBC is just four points out of fourth place.

For Starters: UMBC opens the season 1-3 for the first time since 2001-02, when they won their season opener then lost three in a row. That season, the Retrievers went 12-15 in head coach Jennifer Bednarek's last season at the helm.

Battle of Baltimore: Starting with the Retrievers' loss to Coppin State on Nov. 14, UMBC hosted three teams who make their homes in the Baltimore area, with two of the game televised regionally on the Mid-Atlantic Sports Network. In addition to last Tuesday night's game against Towson, the Retrievers also faced Loyola on Nov. 17.

Shall We Dance: UMBC will take on three teams that earned NCAA Tournament berths last season. The Retrievers faced a George Washington team in the season opener which earned a No. 7 seed in the Cleveland regional and defeated 10th-seeded Old Dominion before falling to second-seeded Tennessee in the second round. In addition, Coppin State was seeded 15th in the Bridgeport regional as the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference champion and lost to second-seeded Connecticut in the first round. America East champion Hartford, which upset sixth-seeded Temple in the first round as the No. 11 seed in the Bridgeport regional before falling to third-seeded Georgia in the second round, will host the Retrievers on Jan. 17 and come to the RAC on March 3 for the season finale.

Rohde Hits 800: Sharri Rohde scored her 800th career point on Nov. 14 in the home opener against Coppin State, when she tallied nine points. With a total of 832 points in her career, Rohde is tied for 17th all-time in UMBC history. She is in position to become the 15th player ever at UMBC to score 1,000 career points.

Retrievers Ink Three in Early Signing Period: Three high school seniors have signed National Letters of

Intent to join the Retrievers in the fall of 2007. **Michele Brokans** is a 5-foot-8 point guard out of Lansdale Catholic in Lansdale, Pa. She has helped her AAU team, FENCOR, to three AAU national championships and five straight appearances in the national championship game. **Meghan Colabella** is a 6-foot forward out of Montclair High school in Montclair, N.J., where she was first-team all-league and second-team all-county. **Chrissy Robinson**, the younger sister of UMBC junior forward **Amanda Robinson**, is a 6-foot-3 post player out of Patuxent High School in Lusby, Md., where she averaged a double-double as a junior.

Going Up: One of the league's most improved teams last season, UMBC was picked ninth in the 2005 preseason poll after finishing the 2003-04 campaign with an 8-20 overall record and a 3-15 conference mark. But the Retrievers rattled off six straight wins over America East foes in early February for a program-best 7-9 fifth-place finish in the conference in 2005-06, and at 15-13 overall posted the team's first winning record since 1993-94.

Rohde's Start Streak: Senior **Sharri Rohde** started all 28 games last season for the third year in a row. With a start in the first four games this season, she extended her start streak to 88 games and is sixth all-time at UMBC for career starts.

One-Two-Three: UMBC leads the America East Conference in three-point field goal percentage, shooting 38.8 percent from beyond the arc, and in three-pointers made with 6.50 per game. But the Retrievers also rank 7th in the league in three-point field goal defense, as opponenets are shooting 35.7 percent percent from long distance.

Rohde Moving Up Assists and Blocks Charts: Senior **Sharri Rohde**, UMBC's active leader in assists, blocks and steals, is moving up the Retrievers' all-time charts in the assists and blocks category. Rohde currently has 248 career assists and 68 career blocks, ranking eighth all-time in both categories. **Amanda Robinson** ranks 13th with 50 blocks in her career.

Hughes Joins All-Time Assists Chart: Senior **Brittanie Hughes** also ranks among UMBC's all-time top-15 for career assists. The Retriever point guard currently has 235 career assists, ranking 10th all-time.

in their second-to-last game of the season. But Hughes' streak was snapped on Tuesday when Towson held the point guard to just eight points.

Lending a Helping Hand: Senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes** ranks third in the conference with 4.00 assists per game, and sophomore center **Mackenzie Butler** ranks eighth with 3.50 apg and is tied for third with a 2.00 assist-to-turnover ratio. Butler posted a career-high six helpers in UMBC's 58-56 victory over Loyola, including the dish on the game-winning field goal with 2.1 seconds remaining in regulation.

Close Call: UMBC's 58-56 win over Loyola on Friday was its first two-point victory since Feb. 28, 2004, when it defeated Hartford, 48-46 at RAC Arena. In head coach **Phil Stern's** tenure, the Retrievers are 3-1 in games decided by two points or less.

Cold Hand: The Retrievers have shot just 37.1 percent from the floor in their first four games and have been held under 40 percent in the last three. But their opponents have not fared much better, as Coppin State, Loyola and Towson combined to shoot just 34.4 percent against UMBC. The Retrievers were just 2-6 when shooting below 40 percent last season, with the last win coming against Maine on Feb. 22, 2006, a 60-47 victory while shooting 38.9 percent from the floor.

Milestones: Several Retrievers reached milestones in various statistical categories against Towson on Nov. 21. Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** posted her 450th rebound, while senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes** recorded her 100th career steal. In addition, senior **Heather Luttrell** posted her 250th career rebound.

Streaky Retrievers: UMBC opened the 2005-06 season winning eight of its first 11 games for the program's best start since 1985-86 and its best start ever since becoming Division-I. But the Retrievers dropped the first five

games on their America East Conference schedule to start the new year before a 48-41 win over Albany on Jan. 26 snapped the skid. With that victory, UMBC went on to win six in a row with wins over league rivals Albany, Stony Brook, Binghamton, Boston University, New Hampshire and Vermont. A loss to eventual conference champion Hartford - the only America East opponent which the Retrievers did not beat during the season - on Feb. 15 snapped the streak, and UMBC lost five of their final six games to end the season.

Rohde Earns Second-Team All-Conference: Forward **Sharri Rohde** was selected to the 2006 America East All-Conference Second Team. She led UMBC with 5.8 rebounds per game and ranked second with 12.4 points per game.

UMBC Sets Attendance Record At RAC Arena: On Jan. 26, 2006, UMBC welcomed seven local middle and elementary schools to campus for "Midday Madness," as the Retrievers defeated Albany at RAC Arena in front of 1,312 fans, a UMBC women's basketball record. The activities for the day for the nearly 800 students included an educational speech from head women's basketball coach **Phil Stern**, a tour around campus guided by student-athletes, lunch in one of the school's dining facilities and the women's basketball game at noon. The Retrievers will again hold a "Midday Madness" this season, on Jan. 24, 2007 against Maine.

Reaching Out: Four Retriever basketball players - **Kristin Drabyn**, **Morgan Hatten**, **Stacy Hunt** and **Amanda Robinson** - along with a member of the track and field team, spent their spring break working for Habitat for Humanity in the St. Benard Parish in New Orleans, one of the most devastated communities in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina.
