RETRIEVER UPDATE: UMBC is coming off its second win of the season, a 78-51 victory over NJIT. Five players scored in double digits, led by freshman guard **Carlee Cassidy**' 16 points and senior forward **Sharri Rohde**'s 15. The Retrievers recorded a conference-high 24 assists and shot above 40 percent for the first time since the season opener. The 27-point win was UMBC's largest since defeating Navy by 27 points on Dec. 30, 2005. After a four-game homestand, the Retrievers hit the road for seven of the next eight games.

EAGLE UPDATE: The American Eagles are in the midst of a five game losing streak and have not won a game since defeating Fordham, 78-53, in the season opener on Nov. 10. American is coming off a 57-55 loss to West Virginia in the Loyola-Marymount Tournament. Liz Hayes scored 20 points in the contest and is averaging a team-best 15.8 ppg.

Who's Up Next: UMBC plays back-to-back road games for the first time this season, heading to Teaneck, N.J., to take on former Northeast Conference foe Fairleigh Dickinson on Saturday, Dec. 2, at 2 p.m.

Head Women's Basketball Coach Phil Stern is in his fifth season with the Retrievers and 11th season as a collegiate head women's basketball coach. Among the many accolades in Stern's file are the 2001-02 WBCA District III Coach of the Year and Peach Belt Conference Coach of the Year, which he received after taking a USC Aiken squad that finished 5-22 in 1999 to the NCAA Division II Tournament three years later. Stern almost had the same success with UMBC. In his first year with the Retrievers, who missed the Northeast Conference tournament the prior year, Stern took UMBC to the NEC title game. Stern is looking to continue the revitalization of the Retrievers as they continue to grow in the mid-major America East Conference. In 2005-06, he led UMBC to its first winning season since 1993-94 with a 15-13 record, turning around a team that finished 8-20 the year before.

Retriever Uprising

Head coach **Phil Stern** continues to build the UMBC women's basketball program towards the top of the America East Conference. With 15 wins in 2005-06, the Retrievers surpassed their win total from the previous year for the second consecutive season. Below are current notes on UMBC's growth last season.

- UMBC's 15 wins were seven more than its 2004-05 record of 8-20 (UMBC recorded four wins in 2003-04).
- UMBC's 15 wins secured the Retrievers' first .500 season since going 15-13 in 1993-94.
- UMBC's 15 wins is the most regular-season wins since winning 17 games during the 1990-91 season.
- UMBC's 15 wins are tied for the second-most wins since the Retrievers turned Division-I in 1986-87. UMBC's top seasons came in 1990-91 (17 wins), 1986-87 (15) and 1993-94 (15).

- UMBC's six-game win streak (ended Feb. 14, 2006), was the longest since joining the America East Conference.
- The last time UMBC won six games in a row was during the 1993-94 season in which UMBC set a school record with 10 consecutive wins.
- Over the last two years UMBC has recorded its best starts since joining Division-I, last year opening the season 6-1.
- UMBC's seven conference wins is the Retrievers' most wins in the league, topping the four-win mark set in 2003-04.
- UMBC went 9-3 at home, the best mark since going 10-0 in 1993-94.
- UMBC was picked to finish ninth in the conference standings in the preseason coaches' poll, but finished fifth, making the biggest jump from the preseason predictions. Stony Brook made the next-biggest jump, from fifth to second.
- UMBC's success came as the America East Conference was ranked 11th in the RPI poll.

RETRIEVER QUICK SHOTS...

- Five Retrievers scored in double figures in UMBC's 78-51 victory over NJIT.
- Freshman guard **Carlee Cassidy** finished with a game-high 16 points, one off her career mark, on 50 percent shooting (7-for-14), while senior forward **Sharri Rohde** had 15, hitting double digits for the third straight game and fourth time this season.
- Junior forward **Amanda Robinson** scored 10 points and added eight rebounds in 16 minutes off the bench en route to Marlow Sports America East Player of the Game honors.
- Senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes** added six assists to go with her 11 points, and junior guard **Kristin Drabyn** also scored 10.
- The 27-point margin of victory is UMBC's largest since defeating Navy, 71-44, on Dec. 30, 2005.
- UMBC finished the first half on a 14-3 run, scoring the last eight points before the buzzer. Senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes** hit a three-pointer as time expired to cap the rally and send UMBC into the locker room with a 45-29 lead.
- NJIT turned the ball over 17 times in the first half, and UMBC was able to capitalize, scoring 20 points off turnovers in the first period alone.
- The Retrievers scored 13 of the first 16 points of the second period to open up a 58-32 advantage with 13:52 to play. UMBC extended the lead to 30 points at the 5:32 mark on a three-pointer by sophomore center **Suzanne Morris**.
- The Retrievers recorded 24 assists on 29 field goals in the game, just three off the school record of 27 dishes, set on Dec. 2, 1985 against Shippensburg.
- UMBC shot 45.3 percent for the game, their best shooting performance of the season and the first time the Retrievers have shot above 40 percent since the season opener at George Washington.
- The Retrievers scored 70 points for the first time since Feb. 12, 2005, when UMBC defeated Vermont, 72-63. The 78 points are the team's most since an 87-52 victory over Morgan State on Nov. 23, 2004.
- **Sharri Rohde** has not missed a start in her entire college career for 89 consecutive starts. She ranks sixth all-time at UMBC in games started.

News and Notes...

For Starters: UMBC opens the season 2-3 for the first time since 2002-03, when they won their first two games then lost seven straight. That season, head coach **Phil Stern's** first at the helm, the Retrievers finished 14-16 and advanced to the Northeast Conference title game.

Road Trip: After opening the season on the road, the UMBC had a four-game homestand, but the Retrievers hit the road for most of the month of December. Starting with today's game at American, UMBC will play seven of the next eight games on the road. The only home game remaining before the new year is Dec. 6, when Navy visits the RAC Arena.

Thity Below: The Retrievers have held their last two opponents below 30 percent shooting. Towson shot 29.1 percent from the floor, while NJIT shot at just a .270 clip. The last time UMBC held back-to-back opponents to under 30 percent shooting was Jan. 26-Feb. 1, 2006, the first three games of last season's six-game win streak.

Cool Hand, Hot Hand: UMBC shot below 40 percent in three straight games, but had its best shooting performance of the season in its last game against NJIT, shooting 45.3 percent from the field. The first period represented the Retrievers' best scoring half of the season, as they shot 54.8 percent (17-for-31) from the floor.

Lending a Helping Hand: The Retrievers recorded 24 assists on 29 field goals against NJIT, just three off the school record of 27 dishes set against Shippensburg on Dec. 2, 1985. Senior point guard **Brittnie Hughes** posted six assists in the contest and is tied for third in the America East conference with 4.40 apg, while sophomore center **Mackenzie Butler** is eighth with 3.50 apg. The Retrievers rank fifth in the league with 14.40 apg. Butler posted a career-high six helpers in UMBC's 58-56 victory over Loyola, including the dish on the game-winning field goal with 2.1 seconds remaining in regulation.

Rohde's Start Streak: Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** started all 28 games last season for the third year in a row. With a start in the first five games this season, she extended her start streak to 89 games and is sixth all-time at UMBC for career starts.

One-Two-Three: UMBC leads the America East Conference in three-point field goals made with 6.60 per game, and rank second in three-point field goal percentage, shooting 36.7 percent from long distance. Three Retrievers rank in the top 15 in three-point field goal percentage, led by senior point guard **Brittnie Hughes**, who is fourth (.526). Freshman guard **Carlee Cassidy** is 12th (.375) and junior guard **Kristin Drabyn** is tied for 14th (.333). The trio also rank in the top 15 in three-pointers made, led by Hughes, who is sixth with 2.00 per game.

Seeing Double: Five Retrievers scored in double figures against NJIT, led by freshman guard

Carlee Cassidy's 16 points, one short of her career best. In addition, senior forward **Sharri Rohde** scored 15 points, senior point guard **Brittnie Hughes** and junior guard **Kristin Drabyn** had 11 each, and junior forward **Amanda Robinson** scored 10. The last time five Retrievers scored at least 10 points each was Dec. 20, 2005, at IPFW.

Seeing Double Take Two: Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** has scored in double figures in each of the last three games and four of five this season. Rohde and senior point guard **Brittnie Hughes** are tied for ninth in the conference with 12.8 ppg. Hughes had her five-game double-figure scoring streak, which dated to last season, snapped against Towson, but scored 11 against NJIT and has reached the double-digit mark in four of five games this season.

Seventy Plus: UMBC's 78 points against NJIT were the most the team has scored since Nov. 23, 2004, in an 87-52 victory over Morgan State. Sunday's game marked the first time the Retrievers have scored 70 points since Feb. 12, 2006, against Vermont, when they posted 72. UMBC's 27-point margin of victory over the Highlanders (78-51) is its largest since defeating Navy by 27 points, 71-44, on Dec. 30, 2005.

Rohde Passes 800: **Sharri Rohde** scored her 800th career point on Nov. 14 in the home opener against Coppin State, when she tallied nine points. With a total of 847 points in her career, Rohde ranks 17th all-time in UMBC history. She is in position to become the 15th player ever at UMBC to score 1,000 career points.

Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** is seventh in minutes played (2,962), fifth in minutes per game (33.3), third in field goal percentage (.494), 11th in three-pointers made (56), ninth in three-pointers attempted (193), 10th in three-point field goal percentage (.290) and ninth in free throw percentage (.699). Senior point guard **Brittnie Hughes** ranks ninth in minutes per game (29.1), fourth in three-point field goal percentage (.313) and fourth in free throw percentage (.720). Finally, senior **Heather Luttrell** ranks eighth in three-pointers made (67) and attempted (203) and third in three-point field goal percentage (.330).

Close Call: UMBC's 58-56 win over Loyola on Friday was its first two-point victory since Feb. 28, 2004, when it defeated Hartford, 48-46 at RAC Arena. In head coach **Phil Stern's** tenure, the Retrievers are 3-1 in games decided by two points or less.

Milestones: Several Retrievers reached milestones in various statistical categories against NJIT on Nov. 26. Senior point guard **Brittnie Hughes** posted her 150th career rebound and hit her 50th three-pointer, while junior guard **Kristin Drabyn** scored her 200th career point.

Retrievers Ink Three in Early Signing Period: Three high school seniors have signed National Letters of Intent to join the Retrievers in the fall of 2007. **Michele Brokans** is a 5-foot-8 point guard out of Lansdale Catholic in Lansdale, Pa. She has helped her AAU team, FENCOR, to three AAU national championships and five straight appearances in the national championship game. **Meghan Colabella** is a 6-foot forward out of Montclair High school in Montclair, N.J., where she was first-team all-league and second-team all-county. **Chrissy Robinson**, the younger sister of UMBC junior forward **Amanda Robinson**, is a 6-foot-3 post player out of Patuxent High School in Lusby, Md., where she averaged a double-double as a junior.

UMBC Picked Sixth in Preseason Poll: The Retrievers were selected to finish sixth in the America East in a vote of the conference's head coaches, the program's

highest preseason billing since joining the America East in 2003. In a crowded middle-third of the conference, UMBC is just four points out of fourth place.

Going Up: One of the league's most improved teams last season, UMBC was picked ninth in the 2005 preseason poll after finishing the 2003-04 campaign with an 8-20 overall record and a 3-15 conference mark. But the Retrievers rattled off six straight wins over America East foes in early February for a program-best 7-9 fifth-place finish in the conference in 2005-06, and at 15-13 overall posted the team's first winning record since 1993-94.

Battle of Baltimore: Starting with the Retrievers' loss to Coppin State on Nov. 14, UMBC hosted three teams who make their homes in the Baltimore area, with two of the game televised regionally on the Mid-Atlantic Sports Network. In addition to last Tuesday night's game against Towson, the Retrievers also faced Loyola on Nov. 17.

Shall We Dance: UMBC will take on three teams that earned NCAA Tournament berths last season. The Retrievers faced a George Washington team in the season opener which earned a No. 7 seed in the Cleveland regional and defeated 10th-seeded Old Dominion before falling to second-seeded Tennessee in the second round. In addition, Coppin State was seeded 15th in the Bridgeport regional as the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference champion and lost to second-seeded Connecticut in the first round. America East champion Hartford, which upset sixth-seeded Temple in the first round as the No. 11 seed in the Bridgeport regional before falling to third-seeded Georgia in the second round, will host the Retrievers on Jan. 17 and come to the RAC on March 3 for the season finale.
