RETRIEVER UPDATE: UMBC is coming off a heartbreaking 61-60 loss to American on Nov. 28, which dropped its record to 2-4 overall. Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** recorded her third career double-double with 17 points and 10 rebounds. She has scored in double figures in the last four games and five of six this season. Rohde is averaging a team-best 13.5 ppg, followed by senior point guard **Brittnie Hughes'** 12.8 ppg. Hughes has posted six or more assists in each of the last three games and four of six overall.

KNIGHT UPDATE: The Fairleigh Dickinson Knights are coming off a 63-48 victory over Lafayette in their home opener on Nov. 29. Three players are averaging double figures, including freshman forward Christy Altamirano's team-best 13.0 ppg. She tallied a game-high 16 points against the Leopards. The Knights rank second in the Northeast Conference with 3.25 blocked shots per game and 14.25 assists per game.

Who's Up Next: After back-to-back road games, the Retrievers return to the RAC Arena for their final non-conference home game of the season, as they will take on Navy at 7 p.m. on Wednesday, Dec. 6. UMBC will play five straight road games after Navy to close out December.

Head Women's Basketball Coach Phil Stern is in his fifth season with the Retrievers and 11th season as a collegiate head women's basketball coach. Among the many accolades in Stern's file are the 2001-02 WBCA District III Coach of the Year and Peach Belt Conference Coach of the Year, which he received after taking a USC Aiken squad that finished 5-22 in 1999 to the NCAA Division II Tournament three years later. Stern almost had the same success with UMBC. In his first year with the Retrievers, who missed the Northeast Conference tournament the prior year, Stern took UMBC to the NEC title game. Stern is looking to continue the revitalization of the Retrievers as they continue to grow in the mid-major America East Conference. In 2005-06, he led UMBC to its first winning season since 1993-94 with a 15-13 record, turning around a team that finished 8-20 the year before.

RETRIEVER QUICK SHOTS...

- Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** recorded her third career double-double with 17 points and 10 rebounds at American.
- It was UMBC's first double-double since Amanda Robinson scored 11 points and added 11 rebounds against Albany on March 4, 2006.
- UMBC allowed 50 percent shooting from three-point range for the third time this season. In the other three games, opponents have shot below 30 percent from long distance.
- Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** and point guard **Brittanie Hughes** are each averaging double figures in points, with Rohde at 13.5 and Hughes at 12.8. Both players have scored at least 10 points in five out of UMBC's six games this season, with Rohde accomplishing the feat in four straight.
- Senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes** is averaging seven assists over the last three games and is one shy of 250 in her career. She is tied for the league lead in assists per game.
- **Sharri Rohde** has not missed a start in her entire college career for 90 consecutive starts. She ranks sixth all-time at UMBC in games started.
- The Retrievers have used the same starting lineup in five of six games this season.
- UMBC ranks first in the America East in defense, holding opponenets to a league-best 35.2 percent shooting. But the Retrievers rank eighth of nine teams in field goal percentage, shooting just 38.4 percent from the field.
- Conversely, the Retrievers lead the league in three-point field goals made and rank third in three-point field goal percentage, but rank seventh in three-point defense.

News and Notes...

For Starters: UMBC opens the season 2-4 for the first time since 2002-03, when they won their first two games then lost seven straight. That season, head coach **Phil Stern's** first at the helm, the Retrievers finished 14-16 and advanced to the Northeast Conference title game.

Road Trip: After opening the season on the road, UMBC had a four-game homestand, but the Retrievers hit the road for most of the month of December. Starting with Tuesday's game at American, UMBC will play seven of eight games on the road. The only home game remaining before the new year is Dec. 6, when Navy visits the RAC Arena.

Nice to See You Again: UMBC and Fairleigh Dickinson are meeting for the 10th time, but just the second since the Retrievers left the Northeast Conference. As league rivals from 1999-2003, the teams played eight times with the Kinghts winning five of those contests. However, the Retrievers have won the last two meetings, including last season's 76-58 victory on Nov. 20, in the Retriever Tip-Off Tournament.

Rohde's Start Streak: Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** started all 28 games last season for the third year in a row. With a start in the first six games this season, she has extended her start streak to 90 games and is sixth all-time at UMBC for career starts.

Double-Double: Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** recorded her third career double-double on Nov. 28 at American with 17 points and 10 rebounds. It was UMBC's first double-double since March 4, 2006, when **Amanda Robinson** scored 11 points and grabbed 11 boards in the regular-season finale at Albany. Rohde last accomplished the feat on Feb. 12, 2006, with 16 points and 10 rebounds against Vermont.

Close Call: Four of UMBC's six games have been decided by five points or less, including the 58-56 win over Loyola on Nov. 17 and the 61-60 loss at American on Nov. 28. The Retrievers are 1-3 in those games. UMBC's 58-56 win over Loyola was its first two-point victory since Feb. 28, 2004, when it defeated Hartford, 48-46 at RAC Arena. In head coach **Phil Stern's** tenure, the Retrievers are 3-2 in games decided by two points or less.

Lending a Helping Hand: The Retrievers recorded 24 assists on 29 field goals against NJIT, just three off the school record of 27 dishes set against Shippensburg on Dec. 2, 1985. Senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes** posted six assists in the contest and has dished out six or more in each of the last three games and four of six overall. She is tied for the league lead with 5.00 apg, while sophomore center **Mackenzie Butler** is eighth with 2.83 apg. The Retrievers rank third in the America East with 15.00 apg.

Seeing Double: Five Retrievers scored in double figures against NJIT, led by freshman guard **Carlee Cassidy's** 16 points, one short of her career best. In addition, senior forward **Sharri Rohde** scored 15

points, senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes** and junior guard **Kristin Drabyn** had 11 each, and junior forward **Amanda Robinson** scored 10. The last time five Retrievers scored at least 10 points each was Dec. 20, 2005, at IPFW. Rohde and Hughes have each scored in double figures in five of UMBC's six games this season, and Rohde has done it in four straight. Hughes had her five-game double-figure scoring streak, which dated to last season.

Seventy Plus: UMBC's 78 points against NJIT were the most the team has scored since Nov. 23, 2004, in an 87-52 victory over Morgan State. Sunday's game marked the first time the Retrievers have scored 70 points since Feb. 12, 2006, against Vermont, when they posted 72. UMBC's 27-point margin of victory over the Highlanders (78-51) is its largest since defeating Navy by 27 points, 71-44, on Dec. 30, 2005.

Rohde Passes 800: **Sharri Rohde** scored her 800th career point on Nov. 14 in the home opener against Coppin State, when she tallied nine points. With a total of 864 points in her career, Rohde ranks 17th all-time in UMBC history. With six points against Fairleigh Dickinson, she will pass Karyn Swann ('92) for 16th place. She is in position to become the 15th player ever at UMBC to score 1,000 career points.

Dishes and Blocks: Senior forward **Sharri Rohde**, UMBC's active leader in assists, blocks and steals, is moving up the Retrievers' all-time charts in the assists and blocks categories. She recorded her 70th career block on Nov. 28 at American, moving into a tie with Sheila Johnson for seventh place all-time, while her 250 assists rank eighth. Senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes** has recorded 30 assists this season and is right on Rohde's tail, ranking ninth with 249 career dishes. Junior forward **Amanda Robinson** is tied for 12th with 51 blocks in her career.

played (2,999), fifth in minutes per game (33.3), third in field goal percentage (.494), 11th in three-pointers made (56), ninth in three-pointers attempted (194), eighth in three-point field goal percentage (.287) and ninth in free throw percentage (.705). Senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes** ranks ninth in minutes per game (29.2), fifth in three-point field goal percentage (.310) and eighth in free throw percentage (.719). Finally, senior **Heather Luttrell** ranks eighth in three-pointers made (67) and attempted (204) and third in three-point field goal percentage (.328).

Hoosier State Trio: Three Retrievers hail from Indiana, and all three find themselves regulars in UMBC's starting lineup this season. Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** leads the team with 13.5 ppg and 8.0 rpg and has started 90 games in a row. Junior guard **Kristin Drabyn** has started every game so far this season, while senior **Heather Luttrell** has only missed one start.

Battle of Baltimore: Starting with the Retrievers' loss to Coppin State on Nov. 14, UMBC hosted three teams who make their homes in the Baltimore area, with two of the game televised regionally on the Mid-Atlantic Sports Network. In addition to last Tuesday night's game against Towson, the Retrievers also faced Loyola on Nov. 17.

One-Two-Three: UMBC leads the America East Conference in three-point field goals made with 6.33 per game, and ranks third in three-point field goal percentage, shooting 33.0 percent from long distance. Two Retrievers rank in the top 15 in three-point field goal percentage, led by senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes**, who is fifth (.458), while Freshman guard **Carlee Cassidy** is 11th (.389). Hughes and junior guard **Kristin Drabyn** are tied for sixth in the league with 1.83 three-pointers per game.

New Kid on the Block: Freshman guard **Carlee Cassidy** has scored 33 of her 44 points this season in two games. She scored a career-high 17 against Coppin State and 16 at American.

Three's Company: UMBC has made at least five three-point field goals in each game this season, with a season-high 10 at George Washington in the season opener. The 10 treys were just four off the school record of 14, set Jan. 17, 2004 against Northeastern. The last time UMBC connected on 10 triples was Dec. 20, 2005, at IPFW. UMBC has not made less than five three-pointers in a game since connecting on just two on Feb. 16, 2006 against Hartford.

Retrievers Ink Three in Early Signing Period: Three high school seniors have signed National Letters of Intent to join the Retrievers in the fall of 2007. **Michele Brokans** is a 5-foot-8 point guard out of Lansdale Catholic in Lansdale, Pa. She has helped her AAU team, FENCOR, to three AAU national championships and five straight appearances in the national championship game. **Meghan Colabella** is a 6-foot forward out of Montclair High school in Montclair, N.J., where she was first-team all-league and second-team all-county. **Chrissy Robinson**, the younger sister of UMBC junior forward **Amanda Robinson**, is a 6-

foot-3 post player out of Patuxent High School in Lusby, Md., where she averaged a double-double as a junior.

UMBC Picked Sixth in Preseason Poll: The Retrievers were selected to finish sixth in the America East in a vote of the conference's head coaches, the program's highest pre-season billing since joining the America East in 2003. In a crowded middle-third of the conference, UMBC is just four points out of fourth place.

Shall We Dance: UMBC will take on three teams that earned NCAA Tournament berths last season. The Retrievers faced a George Washington team in the season opener which earned a No. 7 seed in the Cleveland regional and defeated 10th-seeded Old Dominion before falling to second-seeded Tennessee in the second round. In addition, Coppin State was seeded 15th in the Bridgeport regional as the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference champion and lost to second-seeded Connecticut in the first round. America East champion Hartford, which upset sixth-seeded Temple in the first round as the No. 11 seed in the Bridgeport regional before falling to third-seeded Georgia in the second round, will host the Retrievers on Jan. 17 and come to the RAC on March 3 for the season finale.

Cool Hand, Hot Hand: UMBC shot below 40 percent in three straight games, but had its best shooting performance of the season against NJIT, shooting 45.3 percent from the field. The first period represented the Retrievers' best scoring half of the season, as they shot 54.8 percent (17-for-31) from the floor. But in their last game, the Retrievers had their second-worst shooting performance of the season, 35.0 percent, and they shot a season-worst .200 (5-for-25) from long distance.

Going Up: One of the league's most improved teams last season, UMBC was picked ninth in the 2005 preseason poll after finishing the 2003-04 campaign with an 8-20 overall record and a 3-15 conference mark. But the Retrievers rattled off six straight wins over America East foes in early February for a program-best 7-9 fifth-place finish in the conference in 2005-06, and at 15-13 overall posted the team's first winning record since 1993-94.
