RETRIEVER UPDATE: UMBC is coming off a 78-72 victory over former Northeast Conference rival Fairleigh Dickinson on Saturday. Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** (23 pts, 10 reb) and junior forward **Amanda Robinson** (22 pts, 12 reb) both recorded double-doubles. Rohde added eight assists, leaving her two dishes shy of a triple-double. The Retrievers posted their best shooting performance of the season (.470), led by Robinson's 11-for-15 shooting from the field. UMBC also dished out 26 assists, one shy of the school record. Rohde has scored in double figures in each of the last five games and six of seven on the season. She leads the team with 14.9 ppg and 8.3 rpg.

MIDSHIPMEN UPDATE: The Navy Midshipmen are coming off a 51-34 loss to Georgetown on Monday and are 2-6 on the season. Kate Hobbs led the all scorers with 17 points, accounting for half of Navy's offense. The Mids shot just 20.4 percent in the game and are shooting at a .352 clip on the season. Carly Meyer is averaging a team-best 16.7 ppg.

Who's Up Next: The Retrievers hit the road again this weekend, traveling to Longwood on Dec. 9. The game marks the beginning of a five-game road trip that lasts for the rest of December.

Head Women's Basketball Coach Phil Stern is in his fifth season with the Retrievers and 11th season as a collegiate head women's basketball coach. Among the many accolades in Stern's file are the 2001-02 WBCA District III Coach of the Year and Peach Belt Conference Coach of the Year, which he received after taking a USC Aiken squad that finished 5-22 in 1999 to the NCAA Division II Tournament three years later. Stern almost had the same success with UMBC. In his first year with the Retrievers, who missed the Northeast Conference tournament the prior year, Stern took UMBC to the NEC title game. Stern is looking to continue the revitalization of the Retrievers as they continue to grow in the mid-major America East Conference. In 2005-06, he led UMBC to its first winning season since 1993-94 with a 15-13 record, turning around a team that finished 8-20 the year before.

INSIDE THE SERIES...

Tonight's game marks the 22nd all-time meeting between UMBC and Navy, and the Mids hold a 13-8 advantage, although the Retrievers have won the last two contests between the two teams. The first meeting occurred on Jan. 11, 1978, a 69-44 victory for host Navy. The Mids went on to win six straight games between the two teams before UMBC's first victory, 64-55, on Feb. 8, 1986. The teams have met every year since 1999, with Navy holding a 4-3 edge during that span. UMBC is 5-3 versus Navy in the RAC Arena.

The last time the teams met, Dec. 30, 2005, UMBC came away with a 71-44 victory in Annapolis. The Retrievers opened both halves with 21-6 runs and led by as many as 30 in the game. UMBC senior Matea Pender led all scorers with a game-high 20 points. She shot 6-for-17 from the field and a perfect 6-for-6 at the free throw line. Retriever guard **Kristin Drabyn** scored 13 points, shooting 5-for-6 from the field, while point guard **Brittanie Hughes** scored 12 points and added five assists. UMBC shot 40.0 percent from the floor and held Navy to just 28.8 percent shooting. The Mids were led by 12 points from Ashley Pelzek.

News and Notes...

For Starters: UMBC opens the season 3-4 for the first time since 2000-01. That season, the Retrievers finished 13-15 and lost to Sacred Heart in the first round of the Northeast Conference Tournament.

Road Trip: After opening the season on the road, UMBC had a four-game homestand, but the Retrievers hit the road for most of the month of December. Starting with last Tuesday's game at American, UMBC will play seven of eight games on the road. The only home game remaining before the new year is tonight versus Navy.

Rohde Named Player of the Week: Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** was named the America East Player of the Week on Monday for the week ending Dec. 2. Rohde posted back-to-back double-doubles last week, averaging 20.0 ppg and 10.0 rpg in two games. With eight assists against Fairleigh Dickinson, she was two dishes shy of a triple-double.

Double-Double: Retrievers have posted three double-doubles in the last two games. Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** recorded the third and fourth of her career with 17 points and 10 rebounds at American on Nov. 28, and 23 points and 10 boards at Fairleigh Dickinson on Dec. 2. Junior forward **Amanda Robinson** also posted a double-double against the Knights, scoring a career-high 22 points and grabbing a career-best 12 rebounds. Prior to last week, no UMBC player had recorded a double-double since March 4, 2006, when Robinson scored 11 points and grabbed 11 rebounds at Albany. Rohde last accomplished the feat on Feb. 12, 2006, with 16 points and 10 rebounds against Vermont.

Rohde's Start Streak: Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** started all 28 games last season for the third year in a row. With a start in the first seven games this season, she has extended her start streak to 91 games and is sixth all-time at UMBC for career starts.

Lending a Helping Hand: The Retrievers lead the America East and rank 40th in the NCAA with 16.57 assists per game, and senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes** is tops in the league and 44th in the nation with 5.59 apg. She is averaging 7.0 apg over the last four games, while the Retrievers are averaging 22.67 apg in the last three contests. UMBC dished out 26 assists on Saturday at Fairleigh Dickinson, just one shy of the school record of 27 set against Shippensburg on Dec. 2, 1985. Hughes (7) and senior forward **Sharri Rohde** (8) combined for 15 of the team's 26 assists in the game. The Retrievers also rank second in the conference with a 1.04 assist-to-turnover ratio, and Hughes is third in that category (1.32).

Seeing Double: Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** has scored in double figures in each of the last five games - the fourth-longest streak in the conference - and six of seven on the season. She scored nine points against Coppin State, her lone single-digit scoring performance. Senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes** has scored in double figures five times this season, while junior guard **Kristin Drabyn** has done it four times, including in three of the last four games.

Seeing Double, Part 2: Five Retrievers scored in double figures against NJIT, led by freshman guard **Carlee Cassidy's** 16 points, one short of her career best. In addition, senior forward **Sharri Rohde** scored 15 points, senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes** and junior guard **Kristin Drabyn** had 11 each, and junior forward **Amanda Robinson** scored 10. The last time five Retrievers scored at least 10 points each was Dec. 20, 2005, at IPFW.

Rohde Nears 900: Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** scored her 800th career point on Nov. 14 against Coppin State, and after scoring 23 points at Fairleigh Dickinson on Saturday, she is just 13 shy of 900 for her career. Rohde ranks 16th all-time with 887 career points. Next on her list is former teammate Matea Pender, who is 15th with 971. Rohde is in position to become the 15th player ever at UMBC to score 1,000 career points.

Dishes and Blocks: Senior forward **Sharri Rohde**, UMBC's active leader in assists, blocks and steals, is moving up the Retrievers' all-time charts in the assists and blocks categories. She recorded her 72nd career block on Dec. 2 at Fairleigh Dickinson, moving into a tie with Tammy McCarthy for sixth place all-time, while her 258 assists rank eighth. Senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes** has recorded 37 assists this season and is right on Rohde's tail, ranking ninth with 256 career dishes. Junior forward **Amanda Robinson** is tied for 12th with 51 blocks in her career.

One-Two-Three: UMBC leads the America East Conference and ranks 35th in the NCAA in three-point field goals made with 6.29 per game, and ranks second in three-point field goal percentage, shooting 33.1 percent from long distance. Three Retrievers rank in the top 15 in three-point field goal percentage, led by senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes**, who is fifth (.462), while freshman guard **Carlee Cassidy** is ninth (.350). The trio also rank in the top 15 in three-pointers made per game, led by Drabyn in fourth (2.00) and closely followed by Hughes in fifth (1.71). Cassidy is tied for 14th (1.00).

Three's Company: UMBC has made at least five three-point field goals in each game this season, with a season-high 10 at George Washington in the season opener. The 10 treys were just four off the school record of 14, set Jan. 17, 2004 against Northeastern. The last time UMBC connected on 10 triples was Dec. 20, 2005, at IPFW. UMBC has not made less than five three-pointers in a game since connecting on just two on Feb. 16, 2006 against Hartford.

D-Fense: The Retrievers rank among the top teams in the America East in several defensive categories. UMBC leads the league and ranks 42nd in the NCAA in field goal percentage defense (.355), is tied for second in defensive rebounds (24.86 rpg) and ranks fourth in scoring defense (60.1 ppg).

Milestones: Several Retrievers reached career milestones in Saturday's game at Fairleigh Dickinson. Junior forward **Amanda Robinson** scored her 400th career point, while senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes** recorded her 250th career assist. Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** scored her 875th career point and grabbed her 475th career rebound, while junior guard **Kristin Drabyn** scored her 225th career point on 75 career field goals. Finally, senior forward **Heather Luttrell** connected on her 125th career field goal and junior guard **Morgan Hatten** dished out her 75th career assist.

America East Superlatives: Junior forward **Amanda Robinson's** .733 shooting percentage (11-for-15) at Fairleigh Dickinson on Saturday ranks as the best single-game shooting performance in the America East this season. In addition, her 11 field goals are tied with Stony Brook's Jessica Smith for the most by a conference player this year. Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** and senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes** are among four America East players with a conference-best eight assists this season, as well. As a team, UMBC's 31 field goals against Fairleigh Dickinson tie Stony Brook for the most by an America East team this season, while the 10 three-pointers at George Washington are the most in the conference this year.

Seventy Plus: UMBC's 78 points against NJIT were the most the team has scored since Nov. 23, 2004, in an 87-52 victory over Morgan State and marked the first time the Retrievers had scored 70 points since Feb. 12, 2006, against Vermont, when they posted 72. But after going 11 games between 70-point performances, UMBC has reached the plateau twice in the last three games. The Retrievers tied their season high with 78 points against Fairleigh Dickinson on Dec. 2. However, while UMBC defeated the Knights by six points (78-72), the 27-point margin of victory over the Highlanders (78-51) was its largest since defeating Navy by 27 points, 71-44, on Dec. 30, 2005. UMBC has not lost when scoring 70 or more points since on 91-78 loss at Northeastern on Jan. 17, 2004.

Battle of Baltimore: Starting with the Retrievers' loss to Coppin State on Nov. 14, UMBC hosted three teams who make their homes in the Baltimore area, with two of the game televised regionally on the Mid-Atlantic Sports Network. The Retrievers went 1-2 against their cross-town rivals, with a thrilling 58-56 last-second victory over Loyola on Nov. 17 and losses to Coppin State (59-48) on Nov. 14 and Towson (50-45) on Nov. 21.

Hoosier State Trio: Three Retrievers hail from Indiana, and all three find themselves regulars in UMBC's starting lineup this season. Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** leads the team with 14.9 ppg and 8.3 rpg and has started 91 games in a row. Junior guard **Kristin Drabyn** has started every game so far this season, while senior **Heather Luttrell** has only missed two starts.

New Kid on the Block: Freshman guard **Carlee Cassidy** has scored 33 of her 44 points this season in two games. She scored a career-high 17 against Coppin State and 16 at American. Cassidy earned her first career start at Fairleigh Dickinson but did not score in 10 minutes of action.

Retrievers Ink Three in Early Signing Period: Three high school seniors have signed National Letters of Intent to

She has helped her AAU team, FENCOR, to three AAU national championships and five straight appearances in the national championship game. **Meghan Colabella** is a 6-foot forward out of Montclair High school in Montclair, N.J., where she was first-team all-league and second-team all-county. **Chrissy Robinson**, the younger sister of UMBC junior forward **Amanda Robinson**, is a 6-foot-3 post player out of Patuxent High School in Lusby, Md., where she averaged a double-double as a junior.

Shall We Dance: UMBC will take on three teams that earned NCAA Tournament berths last season. The Retrievers faced a George Washington team in the season opener which earned a No. 7 seed in the Cleveland regional and defeated 10th-seeded Old Dominion before falling to second-seeded Tennessee in the second round. In addition, Coppin State was seeded 15th in the Bridgeport regional as the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference champion and lost to second-seeded Connecticut in the first round. America East champion Hartford, which upset sixth-seeded Temple in the first round as the No. 11 seed in the Bridgeport regional before falling to third-seeded Georgia in the second round, will host the Retrievers on Jan. 17 and come to the RAC on March 3 for the season finale.

UMBC Picked Sixth in Preseason Poll: The Retrievers were selected to finish sixth in the America East in a vote of the conference's head coaches, the program's highest preseason billing since joining the America East in 2003. In a crowded middle-third of the conference, UMBC is just four points out of fourth place.

Cool Hand, Hot Hand: UMBC shot below 40 percent in three straight games, but had its then-best shooting performance of the season against NJIT, shooting 45.3 percent from the field. The first period represented the Retrievers' best scoring half of the season, as they shot 54.8 percent (17-for-31) from the floor and scored 45 points. But in the next game, the Retrievers had their second-worst shooting performance of the season, 35.0 percent, and they shot a season-worst .200 (5-for-25) from long distance. UMBC did another 180 a game later, shooting a season-best 47 percent from the floor at Fairleigh Dickinson, including 50 percent (16-for-32) in the second half for 44 points.

LAST TIME OUT...

UMBC senior forward **Sharri Rohde** and junior forward **Amanda Robinson** both posted double-doubles to lead the Retrievers to a 78-72 victory over former Northeast Conference rival Fairleigh Dickinson Saturday afternoon at the Rothman Center in Hackensack, N.J. Rohde tied a career high with 23 points, scoring 16 in the second half, and posted 10 rebounds with eight coming after halftime. Robinson set new career bests with 22 points and 12 rebounds in the game. The last time two Retrievers recorded double-doubles in the same game was Jan. 29, 2006 at Stony Brook, when Rohde and Matea Pender accomplished the feat.

Two Knights also posted double-doubles in the game, as Christy Altamirano scored 19 points and grabbed 12 rebounds, while Jennifer Walkling scored 14 points and added 13 rebounds. The last time two opponent players recorded double-doubles against UMBC was Feb. 28, 2006, by Stony Brook.

Rohde's 23 points came on 8-for-16 shooting, while Robinson shot a career-best 11-for-15 from the field for her 22 points. Junior guard **Kristin Drabyn** also set a new career high with 16 points in the game.

Rohde was two assists shy of a triple-double, as she added eight dishes. Senior point guard **Brittnie Hughes** also recorded seven assists. The Retrievers shot a season-best 47 percent in the game, including 50 percent in the second half, when they scored 44 points.

UMBC had scoring runs of 9-3, 10-4 and 8-0 in the first half, but Fairleigh Dickinson scored 20 of the last 25 points of the period to take a 37-34 advantage into the locker room. FDU opened their game-high 10-point lead at 49-39 with 17:18 to play in the second half, but UMBC rattled off 11 of the next 13 points, including nine in a row to tie the game at 51-51 with 11:57 left. The Knights regained a six-point lead with 9:40 to play, but the retrievers took a 64-61 advantage on their second 9-0 run of the half. UMBC sealed the victory with another 10-point scoring run.
