**RETRIEVER UPDATE:** UMBC is coming off their most lopsided loss of the season, falling to Navy, 74-56, Wednesday evening. The game was the Retrievers' last at home before the new year. UMBC was a victim of poor free throw shooting, as the Retrievers shot just 48.4 percent (15-for-31) from the line. UMBC was also out-rebounded 43-28. Senior point guard **Brittnie Hughes** scored a career-high 23 points (8-for-13), accounting for 41 percent of the Retrievers' offensive output. Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** scored just six points, breaking a five-game double-figure scoring streak, but she still leads the team with 13.8 ppg.

**LANCER UPDATE:** The Longwood Lancers are coming off a 59-52 loss to UMES on Wednesday and are 4-6 on the season. Abigail Freese scored a game-high 17 points (7-for-14) in the loss, while Odessa Williams added 13 (5-for-7) off the bench. Williams leads the team with 8.8 ppg. The Lancers have lost three in a row and six of their last seven games.

**Who's Up Next:** The Retrievers have a week-long break from competition for final exams before resuming their five-game road trip on Sunday, Dec. 17, when they take on in-state rival and former Northeast Conference foe Mount St. Mary's in Emmitsburg, Md.

**Head Coach Phil Stern**  
**Concordia College, '94**  
**Career: 138-150 (.479) (11th Season)**  
**UMBC: 44-78 (.361) (5th Season)**

Head Women's Basketball Coach Phil Stern is in his fifth season with the Retrievers and 11th season as a collegiate head women's basketball coach. Among the many accolades in Stern's file are the 2001-02 WBCA District III Coach of the Year and Peach Belt Conference Coach of the Year, which he received after taking a USC Aiken squad that finished 5-22 in 1999 to the NCAA Division II Tournament three years later. Stern almost had the same success with UMBC. In his first year with the Retrievers, who missed the Northeast Conference tournament the prior year, Stern took UMBC to the NEC title game. Stern is looking to continue the revitalization of the Retrievers as they continue to grow in the mid-major America East Conference. In 2005-06, he led UMBC to its first winning season since 1993-94 with a 15-13 record, turning around a team that finished 8-20 the year before.

**INSIDE THE SERIES...**

Tonight's game marks the 11th all-time meeting between UMBC and Longwood, and the Lancers hold a 6-4 advantage. The first meeting occurred on Jan. 13, 1983, a 73-55 victory for host Longwood. The Lancers went on to win three straight games between the two teams before UMBC's first victory, 79-74, on Jan. 19, 1985. Last year's meeting marked the first between the two teams since Feb. 14, 1990. Former Division-II Mason-Dixon Conference rivals, the teams met twice a year from 1984-86.

The last time the teams met, Dec. 3, 2005, UMBC came away with a 71-51 victory at the RAC Arena. Point guard **Brittanie Hughes** led the Retrievers with 17 points (6-for-9). The Retrievers led 31-28 at halftime but took control of the game with an 8-0 scoring run in the second half. UMBC scored 17 of the final 23 points of the game for the 20-point victory. Cassandra Smith led the Lancers with 14 points, while Keiva Small had 10.

**News and Notes...**

**For Starters:** UMBC opens the season 3-5 for the first time since 2000-01. That season, the Retrievers finished 13-15 and lost to Sacred Heart in the first round of the Northeast Conference Tournament.

**Road Trip:** After opening the season on the road, UMBC had a four-game homestand, but the Retrievers hit the road for most of the month of December. Starting with last Tuesday's game at American, UMBC will play seven of eight games on the road. The only home game in the month of December was Wednesday evening against Navy.

**Rohde Named Player of the Week:** Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** was named the America East Player of the Week on Monday for the week ending Dec. 2. Rohde posted back-to-back double-doubles last week, averaging 20.0 ppg and 10.0 rpg in two games. With eight assists against Fairleigh Dickinson, she was two dishes shy of a triple-double.

**Double-Double:** The Retrievers posted three double-doubles in two games last week. Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** recorded the third and fourth of her career with 17 points and 10 rebounds at American on Nov. 28, and 23 points and 10 boards at Fairleigh Dickinson on Dec. 2. Junior forward **Amanda Robinson** also posted a double-double against the Knights, scoring a career-high 22 points and grabbing a career-best 12 rebounds. Prior to last week, no UMBC player had recorded a double-double since March 4, 2006, when Robinson scored 11 points and grabbed 11 rebounds at Albany. Rohde last accomplished the feat on Feb. 12, 2006, with 16 points and 10 rebounds against Vermont.

**Rohde's Start Streak:** Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** started all 28 games last season for the third year in a row. With a start in the first eight games this season, she has extended her start streak to 92 games and is sixth all-time at UMBC for career starts.

**Lending a Helping Hand:** The Retrievers lead the America East and rank 40th in the NCAA with 15.88 assists per game, and senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes** is tops in the league and 44th in the nation with 5.00 apg. She is averaging 6.2 apg over the last five games. The Retrievers averaged 22.67 apg in three games from Nov. 26-Dec. 2, but recorded only 11 against Navy. UMBC dished out a season-high 26 assists last Saturday at Fairleigh Dickinson, just one shy of the school record of 27 set against Shippensburg on Dec. 2, 1985. Hughes (7) and senior forward **Sharri Rohde** (8) combined for 15 of the team's 26 assists in the game. The Retrievers also lead the league with a 1.00 assist-to-turnover ratio, and Hughes is fifth in that category (1.25).

**Seeing Double:** Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** had her five-game double-figure scoring streak snapped on Dec. 6, when she posted only six points - her lowest total of the season - against Navy. She and senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes** have each scored in double digits in six of UMBC's eight games this season, while junior guard **Kristin Drabyn** has done it five times, including four of the last five games.

In addition, senior forward **Sharri Rohde** scored 15 points, senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes** and junior guard **Kristin Drabyn** had 11 each, and junior forward **Amanda Robinson** scored 10. The last time five Retrievers scored at least 10 points each was Dec. 20, 2005, at IPFW.

**Rohde Nears 900:** Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** scored her 800th career point on Nov. 14 against Coppin State, and after scoring six points against Navy on Wednesday, she is just seven shy of 900 for her career. Rohde ranks 16th all-time with 893 career points. Next on her list is former teammate Matea Pender, who is 15th with 971. Rohde is in position to become the 15th player ever at UMBC to score 1,000 career points.

**Dishes and Blocks:** Senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes** and senior forward **Sharri Rohde** are UMBC's active leaders in assists with 259 apiece. They are tied for eighth place all-time in Retriever history. Rohde entered the season with 22 more dishes in her career than Hughes, but the point guard has averaged five helpers per game to catch up. Rohde is also UMBC's active leader in blocks with 73 in her career, ranking sixth all-time. Junior forward **Amanda Robinson** recorded two blocks against Navy on Dec. 6 to take sole possession of 12th place in UMBC history.

**Master Thieves:** Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** entered the season as UMBC's active leader in career steals, 10 ahead of classmate **Brittanie Hughes**. But Hughes has averaged 2.00 steals per game in 2006-07 for a team-best 16 and with 108 steals in her career, she has swiped the lead from Rohde, who has recorded five steals in eight games for 107 in four years. Hughes is tied for third in the America East in the category, while the Retrievers rank fourth as a team with 7.88 steals per game.

**One-Two-Three:** UMBC is tied for the league lead and ranks 35th in the NCAA in three-point field goals made with 6.13 per game, and ranks third in three-point field goal percentage, shooting 32.7 per-

cent from long distance. Three Retrievers rank in the top 10 in three-point field goal percentage, led by senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes**, who is second (.464), while freshman guard **Carlee Cassidy** is seventh (.381) and junior guard **Kristin Drabyn** is 10th (.320). Drabyn also ranks fourth in the America East with 2.00 three-pointers made per game, and Hughes is seventh with 1.63 per game. However, UMBC ranks seventh in three-point field goal percentage defense, as opponents are shooting at a .340 clip from long distance.

**Three's Company:** UMBC has made at least five three-point field goals in each game this season, with a season-high 10 at George Washington in the season opener. The 10 treys were just four off the school record of 14, set Jan. 17, 2004 against Northeastern. The last time UMBC connected on 10 triples was Dec. 20, 2005, at IPFW. UMBC has not made less than five three-pointers in a game since connecting on just two on Feb. 16, 2006 against Hartford.

**D-Fense:** The Retrievers rank among the top teams in the America East in several defensive categories. UMBC leads the league and ranks 42nd in the NCAA in field goal percentage defense (.365) and ranks fourth in defensive rebounds (24.38 rpg) and scoring defense (61.9 ppg). The Retrievers have also forced 135 turnovers while committing just 127 and rank third in the conference in turnover margin.

**Milestones:** Several Retrievers reached career milestones in Wednesday's game against Navy. Senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes** drilled her 225th field goal, while junior forward **Amanda Robinson** recorded her 75th career steal and sophomore center **Mackenzie Butler** pulled down her 75th career rebound.

**America East Superlatives:** Junior forward **Amanda Robinson's** .733 shooting percentage (11-for-15) at Fairleigh Dickinson last Saturday ranks as the best single-game shooting performance in the America East this season. In addition, her 11 field goals are tied with Stony Brook's Jessica Smith for the most by a conference player this year. Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** and senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes** are among four America East players with a conference-best eight assists this season, as well. As a team, UMBC's 10 three-pointers at George Washington are the most in the conference this year, as are the Retrievers' 26 assists at Fairleigh Dickinson.

**Close Calls:** Four of UMBC's eight games have been decided by five points or less, including the 58-56 win over Loyola on Nov. 17 and the 61-60 loss at American on Nov. 28. The Retrievers are 1-3 in those games. UMBC's 58-56 win over Loyola was its first two-point victory since Feb. 28, 2004, when it defeated Hartford, 48-46 at RAC Arena. In head coach **Phil Stern's** tenure, the Retrievers are 3-2 in games decided by two points or less.

**Seventy Plus:** UMBC's 78 points against NJIT were the most the team has scored since Nov. 23, 2004, in an 87-52 victory over Morgan State and marked the first time the Retrievers had scored 70 points since Feb. 12, 2006, against Vermont, when they posted 72. But after going 11 games between 70-point performances, UMBC reached the plateau twice in three games. The Retrievers tied their season high with 78 points against Fairleigh Dickinson on Dec. 2. However, while UMBC defeated the Knights by six points (78-72), the 27-point margin of victory over the Highlanders (78-51) was its largest since defeating Navy by 27 points, 71-44, on Dec. 30, 2005. UMBC has not lost when scoring 70 or more points since on 91-78 loss at Northeastern on Jan. 17, 2004.

**Seventy Plus, Part 2:** The Retrievers allowed 74 points to Navy on Wednesday, the most an opponent has scored against UMBC this season. The 18-point loss (74-56) was also UMBC's most lopsided since falling to Hartford by 24 points (76-52) on Jan. 14, 2006. The Retrievers are 1-2 this season when allowing 70 or more points, the lone win coming at Fairleigh Dickinson on Dec. 2. Prior to that game, the last time UMBC won a game in which it allowed 70 or more points was Dec. 12, 1999, an 80-79 victory over Drexel.

**On the Glass:** Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** ranks second in the America East with 7.8 rebounds per game, nearly three more rebounds per contest than her career average entering the season. However, the Retrievers have been

out-rebounded by nearly six boards per game this season, the second-worst margin in the conference, and have only won the rebounding battle twice. UMBC has been out-rebounded by 15 in games against George Washington and Navy.

**At the Line:** The Retrievers rank ninth in the America East in free throw percentage (.619), and shot a season-worst 48.4 percent (15-for-31) at the line against Navy. UMBC's 19-for-24 (.792) performance against Loyola on Nov. 17 was the only game in which the team has shot better than 70 percent from the charity stripe.

**Cool Hand, Hot Hand:** UMBC shot below 40 percent in three straight games, but had its then-best shooting performance of the season against NJIT, shooting 45.3 percent from the field. The first period represented the Retrievers' best scoring half of the season, as they shot 54.8 percent (17-for-31) from the floor and scored 45 points. But in the next game, the Retrievers had their second-worst shooting performance of the season, 35.0 percent, and they shot a season-worst .200 (5-for-25) from long distance. UMBC did another 180 a game later, shooting a season-best 47 percent from the floor at Fairleigh Dickinson, including 50 percent (16-for-32) in the second half for 44 points. Sticking with their pattern, the Retrievers shot at just a .353 clip in the next game against Navy.

**Hoosier State Trio:** Three Retrievers hail from Indiana, and all three find themselves regulars in UMBC's starting lineup this season. Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** leads the team with 14.9 ppg and 8.3 rpg and has started 91 games in a row. Junior guard **Kristin Drabyn** has started every game so far this season, while senior **Heather Luttrell** has only missed two starts.

**New Kid on the Block:** Freshman guard **Carlee Cassidy** has scored 33 of her 47 points this season in two games. She scored a career-high 17 against Coppin State and 16 at American. Cassidy earned her first career start at Fairleigh Dickinson but did not score in 10 minutes of action.

**Battle of Baltimore:** UMBC hosted three straight teams who make their homes in the Baltimore area, with two of the game televised regionally on the Mid-Atlantic Sports Network. The Retrievers went 1-2 against their cross-town rivals, with a thrilling 58-56 last-second victory over Loyola on Nov. 17 and losses to Coppin State (59-48) on Nov. 14 and Towson (50-45) on Nov. 21. UMBC also hosted in-state rival Navy on Dec. 6 and lost, 74-56, to fall to 1-3 against opponents from Maryland this season.

**Shall We Dance:** UMBC will take on three teams that earned NCAA Tournament berths last season. The Retrievers faced a George Washington team in the season opener which earned a No. 7 seed in the Cleveland regional and defeated 10th-seeded Old Dominion before falling to second-seeded Tennessee in the second round. In addition, Coppin State was seeded 15th in the Bridgeport regional as the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference champion

## Last Time Out: Navy 74, UMBC 56 Wednesday, Dec. 6, 2006 RAC Arena, Baltimore, Md.

**Baltimore-**In a game with a combined 46 personal fouls and 54 free throws, the UMBC women's basketball team (3-5) shot just 48.4 percent (15-for-31) from the foul line and fell to Navy, 74-56, Wednesday evening at the RAC Arena.

Senior point guard **Brittnie Hughes** set a new career high with 23 points on 8-of-13 field goals, accounting for 41 percent of the Retrievers' offense, and was named the Marlow Sports America East Player of the Game.

Navy (3-6) held the Retrievers without a field goal for the final 7:10 of play, finishing the game on a 12-2 scoring run.

Despite being down for most of the first half, UMBC took a five-point lead - its largest of the game - at 19-14 with 10:11 to play in the first half. Navy tied the score at 21-21 two minutes later, but the Retrievers went back on top, 27-23, on a three-pointer by junior guard **Morgan Hatten** at the 5:49 mark.

UMBC held onto its lead until Navy's Margaret Knap hit a trey with 1:34 remaining in the first half, tying the game at 31-31, then hit another triple with 23 seconds left for a 34-31 advantage. The Retrievers pulled to within one point before the half on a pair of free throws by junior guard **Kristin Drabyn**, but the Mids took a 34-33 lead into the locker room.

Hughes led all scorers with 13 points on 5-for-7 shooting at halftime. Navy's Kate Hobbs was 5-for-6 from the floor for 12 points, while Carly Meyer scored 10. The Mids shot 56.5 percent (13-for-23) from the field in the first half.

Hughes drilled a three-pointer just 13 seconds into the second period to put the Retrievers back on top, 35-34, and the lead alternated hands several times over the first few minutes of play before Navy took control of the game.

UMBC held a 37-36 advantage when the Mids went on a 12-3 run to take a 48-40 lead with 14:18 left in the game. The Retrievers tried to climb back in but never got closer than four points, as Navy finished the game on a 27-11 scoring run over the final 13:19.

Navy dominated on the glass, out-rebounding the Retrievers 43-28 and limiting UMBC to just seven offensive rebounds. The Mids committed 22 turnovers to the Retrievers' 15, but only eight of Navy's turnovers came after halftime.

Navy's bench also outscored UMBC's 41-9, as Knap scored 22 points as a reserve. She led three players in double figures, followed by Meyer, who posted a double-double with 19 points and 10 rebounds, and Hobbs, who scored 12 points.

Hughes' 23 points were a game high. Drabyn also reached double digits with 10 points.

The 18-point loss is UMBC's largest of the season and most lopsided since falling to Hartford, 76-52, on Jan. 14, 2006.
