RETRIEVER UPDATE: UMBC is 5-6 on the season but has not played since a 69-61 victory at Rider on Dec. 19. Four players scored in double figures in the game, including senior forward **Sharri Rohde** (21), junior forward **Amanda Robinson** (16), senior point guard **Brittnie Hughes** (13) and junior guard **Kristin Drabyn** (10). Rohde leads the team with 14.9 ppg and 7.5 rpg. The Retrievers lead the America East Conference in field goal percentage defense and rank second in assists and assist-to-turnover ratio, while Rohde leads the league in rebounding.

ISLANDERS UPDATE: The Texas A&M-Corpus Christi Islanders are 4-6 on the season but have not played since a 73-68 loss at Texas on Dec. 21. The Islanders have won four of their last six games after losing the first four of the season. Three players are averaging in double figures, led by Nicole Duncan's 17.9 ppg and followed by Kirbria Lewis (14.3) and Jillianne Duffy (12.2). UTAMCC leads the Southland Conference in field goal percentage (.427) and three-point field goal percentage (.372).

Who's Up Next: The Retrievers conclude their five-game road trip against another Southland Conference opponent, Texas State, tomorrow, the second day of the UTPA Battle at the Border Holiday Tournament. UMBC then returns home to open America East Conference play against Boston University on Jan. 4.

Head Women's Basketball Coach Phil Stern is in his fifth season with the Retrievers and 11th season as a collegiate head women's basketball coach. Among the many accolades in Stern's file are the 2001-02 WBCA District III Coach of the Year and Peach Belt Conference Coach of the Year, which he received after taking a USC Aiken squad that finished 5-22 in 1999 to the NCAA Division II Tournament three years later. Stern almost had the same success with UMBC. In his first year with the Retrievers, who missed the Northeast Conference tournament the prior year, Stern took UMBC to the NEC title game. Stern is looking to continue the revitalization of the Retrievers as they continue to grow in the mid-major America East Conference. In 2005-06, he led UMBC to its first winning season since 1993-94 with a 15-13 record, turning around a team that finished 8-20 the year before.

News and Notes...

For Starters: UMBC opens the season 5-6 for the second time in three years, as the Retrievers five of the first seven games in 2004-05 before losing four straight and 18 of the last 21 games and finished the season 8-20 overall and 3-15 in the America East.

Road Trip: After opening the season on the road, UMBC had a four-game homestand, but the Retrievers have hit the road for most of the month of December. Starting on Nov. 28 at American, UMBC will play seven of eight games on the road, concluding with this week's Battle at the Border Holiday Tournament at UTPA. The only home game in the month of December was Dec. 6 against Navy.

Rohde's Start Streak: Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** started all 28 games last season for the third year in a row. With a start in each of the first 11 games this season, she has extended her start streak to 95 games and is sixth all-time at UMBC for career starts. Rohde is on pace to break UMBC's record for most career starts on Feb. 7, 2007 at Stony Brook.

Double-Double: The Retrievers posted three double-doubles in two games to start the month of December. Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** recorded the third and fourth of her career with 17 points and 10 rebounds at American on Nov. 28, and 23 points and 10 boards at Fairleigh Dickinson on Dec. 2. Junior forward **Amanda Robinson** also posted a double-double against the Knights, scoring a career-high 22 points and grabbing a career-best 12 rebounds. Prior to that week, no UMBC player had recorded a double-double since March 4, 2006, when Robinson scored 11 points and grabbed 11 rebounds at Albany. Rohde last accomplished the feat on Feb. 12, 2006, with 16 points and 10 rebounds against Vermont.

Sharri Rohde, who has reached the 20-point plateau in the last two games. Senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes** has done it twice, while junior forward **Amanda Robinson** has also accomplished the feat. Rohde and Hughes have each scored a team-high 23 this season.

Double Vision: Five Retrievers scored in double figures against NJIT on Nov. 26, led by freshman guard **Carlee Cassidy's** 16 points, one short of her career best. In addition, senior forward **Sharri Rohde** scored 15 points, senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes** and junior guard **Kristin Drabyn** had 11 each, and junior forward **Amanda Robinson** scored 10. The last time five Retrievers scored at least 10 points each was Dec. 20, 2005, at IPFW. Four players accomplished the feat at Rider on Dec. 19, led by Rohde's 21 points and followed by Robinson (16), Hughes (13) and Drabyn (10).

Seeing Double: Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** had her five-game double-figure scoring streak snapped on Dec. 6, when she posted only six points - her lowest total of the season - against Navy, but she has reached the 10-point plateau in the last three games and nine out of 11 this season. Senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes** and junior guard **Kristin Drabyn** have each scored in double digits seven times, with Drabyn reaching the 10-point plateau in six of the last eight games.

Rohde Named Player of the Week: Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** was named the America East Player of the Week for the week ending Dec. 2. Rohde posted back-to-back double-doubles last week, averaging 20.0 ppg and 10.0 rpg in two games. With eight assists against Fairleigh Dickinson, she was two dishes shy of a triple-double.

Lending a Helping Hand: The Retrievers rank second in the America East with 14.55 assists per game, and senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes** is fourth in the league with 4.27 apg. The Retrievers averaged 22.67 apg in three games from Nov. 26-Dec. 2, but averaged only 9.0 apg in the next three contests. Similarly, Hughes averaged 7.0 apg from Nov. 21-Dec. 2, but she has tallied only 10 in four games since then. UMBC dished out a season-high 26 assists on Dec. 2 at Fairleigh Dickinson, just one shy of the school record of 27 set against Shippensburg on Dec. 2, 1985. Hughes (7) and

senior forward **Sharri Rohde** (8) combined for 15 of the team's 26 assists in the game. The Retrievers also rank second in the conference with a 0.93 assist-to-turnover ratio, and three Retrievers rank in the top 10 in that category - junior guard **Morgan Hatten** (2nd, 1.92), sophomore center **Mackenzie Butler** (6th, 1.54) and Hughes (9th, 1.15).

Rohde Passes 900: Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** scored her 900th career point on Dec. 9 with 13 points at Longwood. She ranks 16th all-time with 947 career points. Next on her list is former teammate Matea Pender, who is 15th with 971. Rohde is in position to become the 15th player ever at UMBC to score 1,000 career points.

Dishes and Blocks: Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** and senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes** are UMBC's active leaders in assists with 268 and 266, respectively. They rank eighth and ninth all-time in Retriever history. Rohde entered the season with 22 more dishes in her career than Hughes, but the point guard has averaged 4.27 helpers per game to catch up. Rohde is also UMBC's active leader in blocks with 78 in her career and ranks fifth all-time. Junior forward **Amanda Robinson** has recorded eight blocks in the last four games to move into 11th place in UMBC history with 59.

D-Fense: UMBC held Longwood to just 16 points in the second half, the lowest total an opponent has scored in one half against the Retrievers this season. The 16 points came on 18.5 percent shooting, the second-lowest shooting percentage by a UMBC opponent in a half (NJIT shot 16.7 percent in the second period). The Retrievers rank among the top teams in the America East in several defensive categories. UMBC leads the league in field goal percentage defense (.368). The Retrievers have also forced 204 turnovers while committing just 172 and rank third in the conference in turnover margin (+2.91 tpg). UMBC has forced 20 or more turnovers in each of the last four games.

Master Thieves: Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** entered the season as UMBC's active leader in

career steals, 10 ahead of classmate **Brittanie Hughes**. But Hughes has averaged 2.36 steals per game in 2006-07 for a team-best 26 and with 118 steals in her career, she has swiped the lead from Rohde, who has recorded 14 steals in 11 games for 1.16 in four years. Hughes ranks third in the America East in the category, while the Retrievers rank fourth as a team with 8.36 steals per game.

One-Two-Three: UMBC ranks third in the America East in three-point field goals made with 5.73 per game, and ranks fifth in the conference in three-point field goal percentage, shooting 32.3 percent from long distance. Senior point guard **Brittanie Hughes** ranks third (.444) in the category. Junior guard **Kristin Drabyn** is also tied for second in the America East with 2.00 three-pointers made per game, and Hughes is ninth with 1.45 per game.

Three's Company: UMBC hit a season-low three three-pointers on Dec. 17 at Mount St. Mary's, shooting just 18.8 percent from long distance (3-for-16). The performance snapped the Retrievers' 14-game streak of connecting on at least five treys, which dated to Feb. 16, 2006 against Hartford. UMBC hit a season-high 10 triples in the season opener at George Washington and were just four off the school record of 14, set Jan. 17, 2004 against Northeastern. The last time the Retrievers connected on 10 three-pointers was Dec. 20, 2005, at IPFW.

On the Glass: Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** leads the America East Conference with 7.5 rebounds per game, 2.5 more rebounds per contest than her career average entering the season. Junior forward **Amanda Robinson** also ranks ninth in the league with 5.8 rpg. However, the Retrievers have been out-rebounded by nearly eight boards per game this season, the worst margin in the conference, and have only won the rebounding battle twice. UMBC has been out-rebounded by 15.25 rpg in the last four games.

At the Line: The Retrievers rank seventh in the America East in free throw percentage (.653), and shot a season-worst 48.4 percent (15-for-31) at the line against Navy. However, UMBC had its best performance from the charity stripe this season on Dec. 17 at Mount St. Mary's, shooting 81.8 percent (9-for-11), and the Retrievers have shot better than 70 percent in the three games since Navy. Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** was a perfect 8-for-8 from the free throw line against the Mount and has hit 16 of her last 17 foul shots.

Close Calls: Four of UMBC's 10 games have been decided by five points or less, including the 58-56 win over Loyola on Nov. 17 and the 61-60 loss at American on Nov. 28. The Retrievers are 1-3 in those games. UMBC's 58-56 win over Loyola was its first two-point victory since Feb. 28, 2004, when it defeated Hartford, 48-46 at RAC Arena. In head coach **Phil Stern's** tenure, the Retrievers are 3-2 in games decided by two points or less.

Seventy Plus: UMBC's 78 points against NJIT were the most the team has scored since Nov. 23, 2004, in an 87-52 victory over Morgan State and marked the first time the Retrievers had scored 70 points since Feb. 12, 2006, against Vermont, when they posted 72. But after going 11 games between 70-point performances, UMBC reached the plateau twice in three games. The Retrievers tied their season high with 78 points against Fairleigh Dickinson on Dec. 2. However, while UMBC defeated the Knights by six points (78-72), the 27-point margin of victory over the Highlanders (78-51) was its largest since defeating Navy by 27 points, 71-44, on Dec.

30, 2005. UMBC has not lost when scoring 70 or more points since on 91-78 loss at Northeastern on Jan. 17, 2004.

Seventy Plus, Part 2: The Retrievers allowed 74 points to Navy on Dec. 6, the most an opponent has scored against UMBC this season. The 18-point loss (74-56) was also UMBC's most lopsided since falling to Hartford by 24 points (76-52) on Jan. 14, 2006. The Retrievers are 1-2 this season when allowing 70 or more points, the lone win coming at Fairleigh Dickinson on Dec. 2. Prior to that game, the last time UMBC won a game in which it allowed 70 or more points was Dec. 12, 1999, an 80-79 victory over Drexel.

Hoosier State Trio: Three Retrievers hail from Indiana, and all three are finding regular playing time. Senior forward **Sharri Rohde** leads the team with 14.9 ppg and 7.5 rpg and has started 95 games in a row. Junior guard **Kristin Drabyn** has started every game so far this season and is averaging 10.0 ppg, while senior **Heather Luttrell** has started five games.

New Kid on the Block: Freshman guard **Carlee Cassidy** has scored 33 of her 49 points this season in two games. She scored a career-high 17 against Coppin State and 16 at American. Cassidy earned her first career start at Fairleigh Dickinson but did not score in 10 minutes of action.

Battle of Baltimore: UMBC hosted three straight teams who make their homes in the Baltimore area, with two of the game televised regionally on the Mid-Atlantic Sports Network. The Retrievers went 1-2 against their cross-town rivals, with a thrilling 58-56 last-second victory over Loyola on Nov. 17 and losses to Coppin State (59-48) on Nov. 14 and Towson (50-45) on Nov. 21. UMBC also hosted in-state rival Navy on Dec. 6 and lost, 74-56, to fall to 1-3 against opponents from Maryland this season.

Shall We Dance: UMBC will take on three teams that earned NCAA Tournament berths last season. The

Retrievers faced a George Washington team in the season opener which earned a No. 7 seed in the Cleveland regional and defeated 10th-seeded Old Dominion before falling to second-seeded Tennessee in the second round. In addition, Coppin State was seeded 15th in the Bridgeport regional as the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference champion and lost to second-seeded Connecticut in the first round. America East champion Hartford, which upset sixth-seeded Temple in the first round as the No. 11 seed in the Bridgeport regional before falling to third-seeded Georgia in the second round, will host the Retrievers on Jan. 17 and come to the RAC on March 3 for the season finale.

UMBC Picked Sixth in Preseason Poll: The Retrievers were selected to finish sixth in the America East in a vote of the conference's head coaches, the program's highest preseason billing since joining the America East in 2003. In a crowded middle-third of the conference, UMBC is just four points out of fourth place.

Retrievers Ink Three in Early Signing Period: Three high school seniors have signed National Letters of Intent to join the Retrievers in the fall of 2007. **Michele Brokans** is a 5-foot-8 point guard out of Lansdale Catholic in Lansdale, Pa. She has helped her AAU team, FENCOR, to three AAU national championships and five straight appearances in the national championship game. **Meghan Colabella** is a 6-foot forward out of Montclair High school in Montclair, N.J., where she was first-team all-league and second-team all-county. **Chrissy Robinson**, the younger sister of UMBC junior forward **Amanda Robinson**, is a 6-foot-3 post player out of Patuxent High School in Lusby, Md., where she averaged a double-double as a junior.

Going Up: One of the league's most improved teams last season, UMBC was picked ninth in the 2005 preseason poll after finishing the 2003-04 campaign with an 8-20 overall record and a 3-15 conference mark. But the Retrievers rattled off six straight wins over America East foes in early February for a program-best 7-9 fifth-place finish in the conference in 2005-06, and at 15-13 overall posted the team's first winning record since 1993-94.
