MEET THE COACH



Head Coach Don Zimmerman is guiding the Retrievers in his 14th season and has a 100-89 record at UMBC. His overall mark in 19+ seasons is 172-105. He entered the year 12th in winning percentage amongst all active coaches. Zimmerman led UMBC to its first ever appearances in the NCAA Division I championships in 1998 and 1999. He is a 1976 graduate of Johns Hopkins University, where he was an Honorable Mention All American in 1976. He won three national titles while coaching the Blue Jays in 1984, 1985, and 1987. Coach Zimmerman was inducted into the Greater Baltimore Chapter of the US Lacrosse Hall of Fame in 2003.

Coach Zimmerman is making his 11th trip to the NCAA Tournament and fourth with the Retrievers. He is 9-13 in 22 meetings vs. Maryland, including 2-12 while at UMBC.

STORY LINES: UMBC is making its second consecutive appearance in the NCAA Tournament and fourth appearance since 1998. This is UMBC's third at-large bid to the tournament--they were an automatic qualifier in 2006. This will be UMBC's first meeting with an in-state school in NCAA Division I championship competition.

~ The Retrievers have recorded back-to-back ten-win seasons for just the second time since entering the NCAA Division I ranks (1981) and the third time in the history of the program. UMBC had marks of 10-5 in both 1991 and 1992 and posted 13-win seasons in 1974 (13-5) and 1975 (13-2). The most wins that UMBC has earned in a Division I season was 11 (11-4) in 1999.

~ For the first time in school history, UMBC has three players with 30 or more goals. Freshman Cayle Ratcliffe leads the team with 37 goals and is the leading freshman goal scorer (per game) in the nation. Seniors Andy Gallagher (32 goals) and Drew Westervelt (31 goals) have also reached that plateau.

~ UMBC has had 24 brother combinations compete in the 40-year history of the program, but the Kimeners (P.J. and Terry) will be just the second to suit up together for NCAA Tournament competition. Tim and Josh Hahn competed in UMBC's first Division I appearance in 1998. Gallagher will have his brother, Danny, on the opposite sideline for the Terrapins.

~ UMBC is assured of its first back-to-back winning seasons since their three straight winning campaigns in 1997 (9-3), 1998 (9-5) and 1999 (11-4).

~The men's lacrosse team won the UMBC Retriever Cup this year for the first time in the award's three-year history. The Retriever Cup is a competition between athletic teams in the categories of Athletes Supporting Athletes, Community Outreach, Team GPA and attendance at Sunday Night Lectures. A points system is in place where teams are rewarded for attending other sporting events, volunteering time for the community outreach program, attending Sunday night lectures and for their team's total GPA. All seven of UMBC's seniors were honored for their community service, especially with the team's ongoing relationship with the "Ride With Pride Program" at the Maryland Equestrian Center. The players assist disabled children with horseback riding and perform other duties at the center.

AMERICA EAST TOURNAMENT RECAP: UMBC earned a spot in the four-team America East Tournament for the fourth consecutive year (all four years in league play), but all four previous games had occurred at UMBC Stadium. The Retrievers lost semi-final games to Albany (2004) and Stony Brook (2005), but won the title with wins over Binghamton and Albany in 2006. In Albany, N.Y., the Retrievers earned their second straight trip to the finals with an 11-7 win over Binghamton in the semi-finals as the Retriever starting attack of Westervelt-Gallagher-Ratcliffe scored all 11 goals.

UMBC was 5-0 in games decided by three goals or less entering the title game at Albany, but fell one goal short, 15-14 to the high-powered Great Danes. UMBC rallied from a 13-8 deficit after 45 minutes and had two abbreviated possessions in the final 1:11 to get the game-tying goal, but did not get a shot off.

Drew Westervelt, Andy Gallagher and netminder **Jeremy Blevins** were named to the All Tournament team.

LIVING RIGHT: A Retriever team had never won three overtime games in a season until wins over Brown, Penn and Binghamton this year. UMBC had a 6-1 home record this season and three of those wins have occurred in overtime. UMBC's first five home wins came by a total of seven goals. UMBC is now 9-4 in Don Zimmerman's 13-plus seasons in extra time. The 2005 team was his only other team to win at least twice in extra time in the same season, with victories over Ohio State and Loyola.

ROAD WOES HALTED: The win at Hartford snapped a four-game road losing streak for UMBC, which extended back into last season's NCAA play-off setback at Princeton. In its three road losses at Denver, Maryland and Albany, UMBC had managed just six total first half goals and was outscored by a combined 17-6 in the first 30 minutes. In back-to-back road wins over Hartford and Stony Brook UMBC scored a combined 13 goals.

PULLING OUT THE CLOSE ONES: The Retrievers were tied or ahead by just one goal in the fourth quarter in five of six home wins, and they triumphed in all five games. The Retrievers are now 5-1 this season in games decided by three or less goals, with the lone loss occurring this past Saturday at Albany. UMBC has the most wins and best record in the nation one-goal decisions this season at 3-0.

THE IRON CEILING: UMBC has performed admirably against the USILA 10-20 over the past several years, but the Retrievers have dropped their last ten games to teams ranked in the top ten. UMBC's last win over a top ten team occurred in 2003, when they defeated No. 8 North Carolina, 10-8. Since last season, UMBC is now 6-3 vs. teams ranked in the second ten.

FRONT-RUNNERS: The win over Penn was UMBC's first when trailing at halftime since a March 7, 2004 9-8 overtime win over Ohio State. UMBC did not trail a game at halftime during last year's regular season (they were tied four times).

THE POLLING PLACES ARE OPEN: After ending the 2006 campaign ranked #11, the Retrievers were ranked #11 in the pre-season USILA poll. The Retrievers are ranked #13 in this week's USILA Coaches' poll. Nine of UMBC's 13 opponents have been in the Nike/Inside Lacrosse top 20 during the season.

A LOOK BACK: The Retrievers finished the season with their first winning record since 2003...the ten wins is the most for UMBC in a season since

winning 11 games in 1999. UMBC finished the 2006 season ranked #7 in man-up offense (41.7%), ninth in offense (10.33 gpg) and 13th in defense (7.93 gapg). For the second consecutive year, UMBC captured the America East Conference regular season title on the final day of the campaign. Last season, UMBC won at Albany, 9-8, to share the league title with the Great Danes, and, on April 29, the Retrievers produced a convincing 20-9 win over Stony Brook to win the title outright. UMBC was the first #1 seed to win the tournament title since Towson accomplished the feat in 2001. Albany had won three straight America East championships.

IN LEAGUE PLAY: UMBC is now 18-4 in its first three-plus years of America East Conference (regular season) play. They have held 18 of 22 teams to single digits in goals, although they have permitted three of five AEC opponents into double digits this season. UMBC allowed a new team conference high of 13 goals at Albany on March 31.

40TH ANNIVERSARY: UMBC enters its 40th season of varsity men's lacrosse with an updated record of 298-250. They are 182-185 in 26 years-plus at the Division I level.

NEED THAT RADIO/TV CHART: There are 21 freshmen on the 2007 roster and 35 of the 45 players have one year or less of Division I experience.

MAN UP LOOKING UP: The Retrievers are now 23 of 48 (47.9%) on the season and are ranked **fifth** nationally. The Retrievers finished the season **seventh** in man-up offense in 2006 at 41.7%, **second** in 2005 at 44.4%. and **tenth** in 2004 at 37.9%. UMBC had only two man-up chances in two games in the America East Tournament.

OUTPUT INCREASE: In its last seven games, UMBC has averaged 13.6 goals per game and scored in double figures in all seven contests. The Retrievers are now ranked eighth in the nation in offense at 11.47 goals per game.

YOUNG DEFENSE: UMBC held nine consecutive teams under the 10-goal mark last season, its longest streak in school history. However, six of UMBC's first eight foes this year scored in double digits, topped by Hopkins' 15-goal output on March 6. That was the most goals allowed by the Retrievers since a 16-10 loss at Maryland on March 19 of 2005. Before allowing 13 goals to Denver on March 4, UMBC had gone 25 games without permitting 13 or more goals.

HOME COOKIN': UMBC had won five straight at home until Hopkins victory on March 6 and are 10-1 in their last 11 home contests.

HALFTIME MOTIVATION: UMBC has outscored its foes, 46-28 in the third quarter this season. The third quarter was the Retrievers' best last year as well, as they were also +18 (47-29) in the third 15-minute segment.

SCORING TRIO: Through games of last week, UMBC's starting attack trio (Drew Westervelt, Andy Gallagher, Cayle Ratcliffe) was fourth in the nation in scoring with 154 points. The threesomes from Virginia (Rubeor, Glading, Billings), Siena (Girsh, Donovan, Duggan) and Albany (Resetarits, Thomson, Dale) are the only groups ahead of the Retrievers.

HIGHS AND LOWS: UMBC scored a season-high 20 goals in a convincing 20-11 win over Vermont...The 31 goals scored by two teams are the most in a UMBC game since a 17-15 Retriever win over Towson in 2000. UMBC allowed a season-low five goals at Stony Brook. The Seawolves only managed one second half goal.

PLAYER NOTES

Drew Westervelt (31g, 33a) was named co-America East Conference Player of the Week for games ending April 15, 2007 and Player of the Week on April 22. Westervelt scored the game-winning goal with one second remaining in the second overtime in UMBC's wild 11-10 double overtime victory over Binghamton on April 14. He tied a career high with nine points (three goals, six assists) in the rout of Vermont. That nine-point effort is tied for second-best in the nation this season. He now has 108 (tied, 7th all-time) career goals, and became the 11th Retriever to hit the 100-goal plateau. For his career, Westervelt had 48 goals and 30 assists (78 points) in 22 America East contests (3.55 ppg).

- He is the current fourth-leading active scorer in the country with 199 career points. He is tied for second on that list with 91 assists and seventh with 108 goals.

- Westervelt is now fifth in the nation in scoring with 4.27 points per game. He is third in assists (2.20 per contest) and leads the America East Conference in that category.

- The attackman is fourth on UMBC's all-time scoring list and just passed former teammate Brendan Mundorf ('06). His 91 helpers are third all-time.

- Westervelt has points in 21 straight games, which is 16th in the country. He has scored 91 points (48g-43a) in that span, an average of 4.33 points per game. He has at least a point in 57 of the 59 games he has competed in at UMBC--one of the two games he did not score was his freshman year vs. Maryland.

- UMBC is 0-2 this season when Westervelt is held without a goal.

- Westervelt's six-assist and nine-point effort vs. Vermont are both tied for the second-highest single game performance in the nation this year. It is his second career nine-point game, as he scored six goals and added three assists in the AEC title game win over Albany in '06.

- Westervelt has played in 59 career games, a new UMBC school record.

- He has the third-most points (64) of any UMBC Division I player in a single season. He is UMBC's first 60-point scorer since Chris Turner recorded 62 points in 1998

Andy Gallagher (32g,14a) earned America East Men's Lacrosse Player of the Week honors on March 26 in the wake of his six-point effort vs. the Buckeyes the previous day. Four of Gallagher's five goals occurred in the second half and he scored the tenth and eventual game-winning goal. He became the 23rd player in school history to record 100 points and he has moved into 13th place with 141 points (95g-46a). Gallagher is tied for the 11th-leading active scorer in the nation. Gallagher is fourth in the America East Conference with 3.07 points per and 2.13 goals (25th nationally) per game. He posted a career-high eight points (five goals, tying his career high) vs. Vermont, tied for sixth-best in the nation this season. In three career games vs. Maryland, Gallagher has one goal and two assists.

Terry Kimener (17g, 18a) had at least a goal in eight straight games until he was held without a score vs. JHU. His scoring streak of 12 straight came to an end at Albany. In that span, he had 35 points (23g, 12), or 2.92 ppg. Kimener tied his season high with three goals vs. Maryland. Kimener's six-point effort in the opener vs. Brown (3-3-6) is a new career high in points. Kimener is ranked fourth in America East in assists per game (1.20) and sixth in points per game (2.33). He recorded three assists, but did not hit the nets in the America East Tournament. He led UMBC with three goals and one assist vs. Maryland earlier this season after going scoreless in two previous games vs. the Terps. Kimener is one of just five active midfielders in the nation with 80 or more points.

Sophomore middle **Alex Hopmann** (17g, 8a) posted his third straight multi-goal game with a pair of scores vs. Albany, three vs. Princeton (in last year's NCAA First Round) and two in the opener vs. Brown, but was held scoreless in the next three games. He must like playing the Ivies, because he broke the brief drought with a pair of goals vs. Penn. Hopmann scored twice vs. Maryland and tied a school record with three extra-man goals in the 11-9 win over Towson. Hopmann is tied for fourth in the America East Conference with 6.07 shots per game. He tied a career high with a team-high four points (3g, 1a) in Saturday's game at Albany, scoring UMBC's final two goals of the contest.

Goalkeeper **Jeremy Blevins** (9-5, 9.85 gaa) made a career-high 16 saves in the win over Air Force, while playing 52:15. He only allowed five of the seven AFA goals. The 14 goals he allowed vs. JHU was the most last year's America East Rookie of the Year has allowed in a game. In two wins vs. Towson and Hartford, Blevins made 20 saves and

allowed 11 goals. He allowed a season-low five goals, while making 12 saves vs. Stony Brook. Blevins is third in America East in saves per game with 11.13. He has a career record 19-10 and now has 291 career saves, already ninth on UMBC's all-time list.

Freshmen **Kyle Wimer** (10g, 10a) and **Cayle Ratcliffe** (37g, 7a) have made an immediate impact on the offensive end for UMBC. Wimer was named America East Conference Rookie of the Week on March 5 as he scored a goal and added six assists in UMBC's two games in Colorado. He broke a five-game streak without a goal by scoring twice in 39 seconds vs. Albany. Wimer posted his first career hat-trick with three goals at Hartford and scored twice in Saturday's setback at Albany.

Ratcliffe earned the same honor on March 12 after his brilliant six-goal effort and game-winning goal in double overtime vs. Penn. Ratcliffe tied a long-standing UMBC record with his six-goal effort in the win over Penn. His six goals equaled Jason Smith's six tallies in the 1991 opener vs. Marist for a Retriever freshman record. Of course, Ratcliffe got the game-winner with 14 seconds to play in the second overtime period. He leads the team with 37 goals, all of which have occurred in the past 13 games. He was honored for the second time this season as the league's Rookie of the Week after scoring five goals and adding two assists in UMBC's wins over Towson and Hartford. He is 10th in the nation with 2.47 goals per game (3rd in America East) and earned his third and fourth Rookie of the Week awards in the last two weeks of the regular season. Ratcliffe's 37 goals is the most ever for a Retriever freshman and the most since Jeff Ratcliffe (also a Canadian, but no relation) scored 44 goals in 1998. He has scored multiple goals in nine consecutive games and has converted 55.2% (37/67) of his shots...50 percent (Tim Stecher, 19/38, 1989) is the current school record.

Junior face-off specialist **Taylor Marino** (team-high 59 ground balls) has won 156 face-offs this season, which is currently fifth for a single season in school history. Freshmen **Mike Carmardo** (two goals) and **Lance Diamond** scored their first career goals in the win over Hartford, while classmates **J.D. Harkey** and **Jordan Pierce** posted their first assists. Senior midfielder **P.J. Kimener** recorded his first career multi-goal game (two goals) vs. Binghamton and posted his first hat-trick vs. Albany on Saturday. Freshman attackman **Matt Latham** has a goal in three of his last four games.
