Story Lines

*** This is UMBC's first 3-0 start in Randy Monroe's four years and first since the 2002-03 season. The Retrievers started the 2001-02 campaign (20-9 overall) at at school Division I best 5-0.

*** UMBC was selected to finish fifth in the coaches' pre-season poll. The Retrievers tied for fourth (7-9) place in the 2006-07 season and advanced to the league semifinals. Boston University, winner of a conference-best five America East Championships, is the pre-season choice of the coaches to win the league title in 2007-08.

*** Senior **Cavell Johnson** and juniors **Jay Greene** and **Darryl Proctor** were named captains of the 2007-08 team.

*** Transfers Johnson, Proctor and **Ray Barbosa** combined for 43 points and 20 rebounds in their UMBC debuts in the 81-78 win over Saint Peter's. The trio had scored a combined 2,387 points in their previous collegiate seasons.

*** Tonight's game will a homecoming of sorts for Greene (pictured right, Whitehall) and Barbosa (Allentown).

*** Barbosa earned America East Player of the Week honors for his efforts vs. Saint Peter's, while Johnson made it back-to-back for the Retrievers by earning the honor this week.

*** **Brian Hodges** moved into 12th place on UMBC's all-time scoring list. He just surpassed the 1,100-point plateau (1,133) and set a school record by hitting all 12 free throw attempts in Tuesday's 76-69 win at La Salle.

*** The Retrievers are in the midst of three straight games on the road, at La Salle, at Richmond (Nov. 17) and at Lafayette (Nov. 20) before returning home to entertain George Washington on Nov. 24. Three of those four games are against Atlantic 10 Conference competition.

*** UMBC came back from halftime deficits to win both its first two contests. They trailed by as many as 12 points early in the second half in the opener vs. Saint Peter's. The Retrievers are averaging 34.3 points per half in the first half of the two games, and 41.3 in the second half. UMBC erased a seven-point deficit with four minutes left in the thrilling 70-68 win at Richmond.

UMBC RETRIEVER BASKETBALL NOTES

UMBC Basketball at a Glance: The Retrievers are competing in their 40th season of intercollegiate basketball and 22nd at the NCAA Division-I level (1986-87). UMBC has played 1,057 games, winning 437 and dropping 620 (.413) and are 244-351 (.410) since 1986-87. The Retrievers enter their fifth season in the America East Conference, after stints as an independent (1986-90), the East Coast Conference (1990-92), the Big South Conference (1992-98) and the Northeast Conference (1998-2003). The Retrievers' last winning campaign occurred in the 2001-02 season, when they went 20-9.

It's Early, But...UMBC is averaging 75.7 points per game in its first two games, compared to the 60.5 ppg the Retrievers averaged in the 2006-07 campaign. The last time UMBC scored 70 or more points in three straight games occurred in the final three games of the 2001-02 campaign. Only one Retriever (Brian Hodges, 14.7 ppg) averaged in double figures for the season. To date, Hodges and Proctor have scored in double figures in all three games, while Barbosa and Johnson are also averaging double-digits through the first two weeks of the campaign.

Straight Shooters: UMBC made tremendous strides from the free throw line last season. The Retrievers hit 63.8% in the 2006-07 campaign, but lead the league at 73.3% in 2006-07. In league games, UMBC were even more proficient at 76.8%. The Retrievers were ranked 42nd in the nation last season in free throw percentage.

But: Despite the efficiency and the fact that the Retrievers played a school record-high 31 games, UMBC's 445 free throw attempts for the season was an all-time school Division I low. **Brian Hodges** led UMBC with 92 attempts in 2006-07; **Darryl Proctor** attempted 167 in the 2004-05 season and 168 the following year.

UMBC opened the campaign, but hitting 27 of 37 attempts from the free throw line. UMBC's highs in free throws made (25) and attempted (35) last year occurred on Nov. 27 at Morgan State. The 27 free throws and 37 attempted were the most for a UMBC team since hitting 30 of 40 vs. Robert Morris on Feb. 9, 2002. The Retrievers followed up with a 25 of 28 effort at La Salle, including a 17-of-17 performance in the second half. UMBC made all 22 of its free throws in the second halves last week and is 37 of 42 (88.1%) in the final 20 minutes on the campaign.

Openers: UMBC has now won its last five home openers and eight of the last ten. The Retrievers had lost three straight road "openers" until defeating the Explorers on Tuesday.

Comeback Kids: UMBC won just once when trailing at halftime in the 2005-06 campaign. Last season, they improved that to five victories (5-13) and the Retrievers opened the 2007-08 campaign with two come-from-behind victories. UMBC's largest come-from-behind win last year was overcoming a 26-14 second half deficit to vanquish UNH, 45-44 at the RAC Arena on Jan. 25 and

they matched that 12-point comeback vs. Saint Peter's.

Cardiac Kids: Dating back to last season, UMBC has won seven straight game decided by five points or less.

Raining Threes: Actually, UMBC has a modest total of 17 3-point field goals (17/39) made through the first three games, but six different Retrievers (Barbosa, Greene, Hodges, Johnson, Proctor, and Spadafora) have at least one trifecta.

Last Year's Game

**UMBC 86, Lafayette 51
Nov. 21, 2006**

BALTIMORE, MD.--In the first game between UMBC and Lafayette, four players scored in double figures as the UMBC men's basketball team scorched visiting Lafayette, 86-51, before 2,213 at the RAC Arena.

The 35-point win was the second largest margin of victory over a Division I foe in UMBC's 21-year NCAA Division I history. Only an 85-49 win over Fairleigh Dickinson in 2000 was greater. The win was the fourth largest in the 39-year history of intercollegiate basketball at UMBC.

Sophomore point guard Jay Greene led the way with a career-high 18 points on a career-best six 3-point field goals. He also added eight assists. Chris Pugh and Greene, combined to hit eight of 13 shots from behind the arc in the first half. The Leopards were within 53-44 with 12:25 to play, but UMBC closed the contest on a run of 33-7. Greene started the run with his final long-distance shot of the night and junior forward Chris Seaborn punctuated it with a slam dunk to put the hosts ahead, 69-46 with 6:50 remaining. UMBC hit 12 of 23 shots from behind the arc, falling one shy of a school record for 3-point field goals. The Retrievers were 32 of 55 overall, hitting at a 58.2 percent clip after entering the game at 35.4 percent.

» Jay Greene is ninth in school history with 110 three-point field goals. He needs two more to move into eighth place, six to reach seventh place, 15 for sixth place and 27 to take over fifth place, one spot behind teammate Brian Hodges.

» Greene led the America East Conference with 5.3 assists per game in 2006-07 and was 37th in the nation. He opened the campaign with 10 assists and zero turnovers vs. St. Peter's, his fourth career game with 10 or more assists.

» With 23 assists in his first three games, Greene has already moved into tenth place on UMBC's all-time assists list with 283 (61 games, 4.64 per game). He needs just 37 more assist to surpass four Retrievers and move into sixth place.

» Greene became the first Retriever Division I player to earn All Tournament team honors in a conference tournament when he was feted after the 2006-07 America East Championships.

» Matt Spadafora is projected amongst UMBC's top seven players on the eve of the 2007-08 season. He is regarded as one of the team's better defensive players.

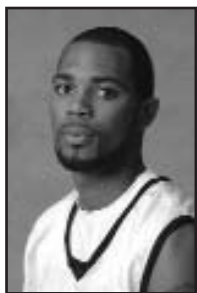

» Johnson scored 15 of his 17 points and garnered all nine of his rebounds in the second half in the win at La Salle. He had three dunks in the game and has five on the young season.

» He led all scorers with 20 points, including the game-winning dunk with 3.2 seconds remaining, in the 70-68 win at Richmond. His nine field goals is a UMBC season high and he posted nine rebounds for the third consecutive game.

» Brian Hodges became the third player in UMBC's Division I history to score 1,000 points in three seasons. With 1,123 points, he has reached the No. 12 spot on UMBC's all-time scoring list. He is 16 points shy of 11th place.

» UMBC's first Division I graduate student to compete in men's basketball. He just became the tenth player in school history (fifth Division I player) to attempt 1,000 field goals (1,009).

» Hodges earned UMBC's top America East honor in men's basketball, earning Second Team All-Conference honors last year. He was also named to the pre-season All-Conference team by the league's coaches.

» He has scored in double figures 52 times for his career (91 current games played).

» He needs 34 3-pt. field goals to reach 200 in his career.

» Hodges set a UMBC school record by hitting all 12 free throw attempts at La Salle. Peter Mulligan held the previous mark of 11-of-11, recorded vs. Wagner on Feb. 17, 2002. Hodges is 20-of-20 to start the 07-08 campaign. It is Hodges' second career game hitting at least ten free throws in a game without a miss (10/10 vs. Stony Brook, 3-3-06).

» Darryl was named Rookie of the Year in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference after the 2004-05 season. He has a career scoring average of 13.6 points per game and a rebounding average of 7.4 caroms per game.

» Proctor recorded his 11th career double-double with game highs of 23 points and 10 rebounds at La Salle.

» He has scored in double figures in all three games to date and hit 14 of 17 free throw attempts in wins over La Salle and Richmond.

» Ray Barbosa scored 1,013 points in three seasons at James Madison University. He was named to the Colonial Athletic Association All-Rookie Team after the 2003-04 season.

» Barbosa was named America East Player of the Week after his 21-point effort and 12 second half points in the come-from-behind win over Saint Peter's.

» He played only eight minutes (sore achilles) vs. La Salle, but was re-inserted into the starting lineup and posted his first career double-double with 11 points and a career-best (and game high) 10 rebounds at Richmond.

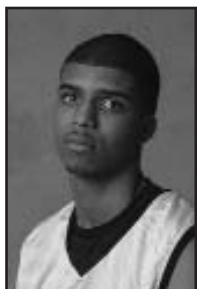

GAME 1: UMBC 81, Saint Peter's 78 November 10, 2007, RAC Arena

Baltimore, Md.—The UMBC men's basketball team rallied from a 12-point second half deficit and edged visiting Saint Peter's, 81-78 before 2,942 fans at the RAC Arena in the opening game for both teams.

The win avenged a Peacock 67-56 win in the 2006-07 opener in Jersey City, N.J.

Senior newcomer Ray Barbosa led the second half surge with 14 points in the final 20 minutes and produced a game high 23 points. He earned America East Player of the Game honors.

After an early tie at 2-2, Saint Peter's utilized some brilliant shooting led for the nearly all of first 35 minutes of play. The Retrievers took their first lead of the game at 69-68 as senior guard Brian Hodges had a stick-back of a missed shot with 4:30 remaining. The Peacocks would recapture the lead and held a 73-72 advantage inside of two minutes remaining.

But Barbosa was fouled going after a loose ball on a Nick Leon turnover and the James Madison transfer hit two free throws to give the hosts the lead for good at 74-73 with 1:52 remaining. After a Peacock turnover and a missed jumper by UMBC, the game's key play occurred when Saint Peter's freshman post Ryan Bacon missed a dunk with 42 seconds remaining and the Retrievers ran down the loose ball. After whittling down the clock, junior guard Jay Greene found Barbosa alone under the basket for a lay-in with 19 seconds remaining.

Greene would come up with a steal on Saint Peter's next possession and converted both free throws with seven seconds left to give UMBC a 78-73 lead with seven seconds remaining.

Greene, who led the America East Conference in assists last season, recorded 10 and posted zero turnovers in 37 minutes of action. He scored eight points and added four steals. Hodges, who moved into 12th place on UMBC's all-time scoring list with 1,094 points, added 14 points, while junior newcomer Darryl Proctor was the third Retriever in double figures with 11 points and eight caroms. Senior Cavell Johnson had nine points, a game-high nine rebounds and three blocked shots.

Senior guard Raul Orta, who hit all six field goal attempts in the first half, led the Peacocks with 19 points, while freshman guard Darryl Lampley debuted with 15 points. Saint Peter's hit 17 of 29 shots in the first half, including seven of 13 from behind the arc. They finished at 51.8% (29/56) for the game. The guests led, 43-36 at intermission.

UMBC hit just 40 percent (24/60), but made 27 (of 37) free throws, 17 more than their guests. The Retrievers outrebounded the Peacocks, 36-32 and forced 17 turnovers, while committing just nine.

Philadelphia, Pa.—Junior forward Darryl Proctor posted a double-double with 23 points and 10 rebounds, leading visiting UMBC to a 76-69 win over La Salle in the Explorers' opener at Tom Gola Arena.

UMBC is off to its first 2-0 start since the 2003-04 season. They have now defeated La Salle in back-to-back seasons on the road.

Senior guard Brian Hodges added 22 points and set a UMBC school record by hitting all 12 attempts from the free throw line. Senior Cavell Johnson scored 15 of his 17 points and garnered all of his nine rebounds in the second half.

For the second straight game, UMBC rallied from a first-half deficit to get the victory. La Salle opened the game on a 7-0 run, and the Retrievers struggled by hitting just nine of 27 shots from the floor. They did however manage to stay within striking distance at 32-28 at intermission.

But it was the Retrievers who opened the second half on a 9-0 run to take a 37-35 lead and they were never headed. The Explorers did come within 4 on a 9-0 run to take a 37-35 lead and they were never headed. The Explorers did come within 46-45, but missed the second of two free throws.

UMBC would gradually build the lead to as many as 16 points at 70-54, but the Explorers hit five late three-pointers to trim the difference to 74-69 with eight seconds left. But Jay Greene hit two free throws on the next possession to seal the victory.

UMBC hit 25 of 28 from the charity stripe for the game and 14 of 29 from the floor in the second half in the rally. Rodney Green led La Salle with 19 points.

GAME 3: UMBC 70, Richmond 68 November 17, 2007, Robins Center

Richmond, Va.—Senior forward Cavell Johnson's dunk with 3.2 seconds left broke a 68-all tie and propelled visiting UMBC to a 70-68 victory over Richmond at the Robins Center.

The win is UMBC's third without a loss this season, their first 3-0 start since the 2002-03 campaign. Richmond falls to 2-3.

Johnson had tied the game on a short baseline jumper with 29 seconds left. On the game-winning play, Retriever junior guard Jay Greene stole the ball from UR freshman guard Kevin Anderson as he tried to penetrate into the lane. Greene drove down the left side of the court and found a streaking Johnson down the center and the UMBC forward slammed home the game winner.

Richmond's Justin Harper's desperation shot from 35-foot fell short at the buzzer.

Johnson led four Retrievers in double figures as he scored a game-high 20 points. He also added nine rebounds. Senior guard Brian Hodges scored 17 points off the bench, while Darryl Proctor and Ray Barbosa scored 14 and 11 points respectively. Barbosa posted a double-double with a game-high and career-best 10 rebounds.

After leading by as many as 10 points at 30-20 midway through the first half, UMBC settled for a 39-25 lead at intermission, their first halftime edge of the young season. But the Spiders quickly rallied and built a seven-point advantage at 64-57 with 4:09 to play. Trailing 66-61 with 91 seconds to play, Barbosa hit a three-point field goal to bring UMBC to within a pair. UR's Dan Geriot and UMBC's Proctor exchanged two free throws each on the next two possessions. A Richmond turnover with 35 seconds left gave UMBC the ball and Johnson converted the jumper on an out-of-bounds play.

UMBC hit 27 of 59 shots (45.8%) from the floor, their top mark of the season, but the Spiders hit 26 of 53 (49.1%).
