MEET THE COACH



Head Coach Don Zimmerman is guiding the Retrievers in his 15th season and has a 103-93 record at UMBC. His overall mark in 21+ seasons is 176-109. He entered the year 13th in winning percentage amongst all active coaches and 11th in total victories. Zimmerman led UMBC to its first ever appearances in the NCAA Division I championships in 1998 and 1999. He is a 1976 graduate of Johns Hopkins University, where he was an Honorable Mention All American in 1976. He won three national titles while coaching the Blue Jays in 1984, 1985, and 1987. Coach Zimmerman was inducted into the Greater Baltimore Chapter of the US Lacrosse Hall of Fame in 2003.

Coach Zimmerman has made 11 trips to the NCAA Tournament and four with the Retrievers.

TONIGHT'S GAME: UMBC continues its rigorous non-conference schedule this evening with a game against the sixth-ranked Maryland Terrapins. With wins in two of its last three games and a good effort vs. then-No. 1 Johns Hopkins, UMBC has jumped back into the USILA top twenty at No. 20.

TOP GUNS: Junior newcomer **Ryan Smith** leads the Retrievers with nine goals in his first five games in the black and gold. Senior midfielder **Terry Kimener** leads the team in scoring with 18 points with eight goals and ten helpers.

THE STOPPER: Junior netminder Jeremy Blevins turned away a career high 20 shots in the win over Denver. It is the fourth-most saves in a single game in the nation this season. His previous high was 18 at Maryland in the first round of the NCAA Tournament last season. It was the most saves by a Retrievers goalkeeper since Kevin Cepelak made 21 saves at North Carolina on April 17, 2004.

A LOOK BACK: In 2007, the men's lacrosse team was the first UMBC team to advance in NCAA Tournament play in the 21-year history of Division I athletics. UMBC made its second consecutive appearance in the NCAA Tournament and fourth appearance since 1998. The Retrievers tied a school Division I record with 11 wins in a season and recorded back-to-back ten-win seasons for just the second time since entering the NCAA Division I ranks (1981) and the third time in the history of the program.

Players who scored 130 of UMBC's 191 goals last season (68 percent) either graduated or did not return for the 2008 campaign.

PLAYING TOUGH: In last year's NCAA first round game, UMBC defeated a team ranked in the top ten (Maryland, No. 6) for the first time since a 2003 win (10-8) over No. 8 North Carolina. The Retrievers had lost ten straight games to teams ranked in the top ten. UMBC has performed admirably against the USILA 10-20 over the past several years and has won seven of their last 11 games vs. teams ranked in the second ten.

WINNING THE TIGHT ONES: UMBC is now 7-2 in games decided by three goals or less since the beginning of the 2007 season.

LIVING RIGHT: A Retriever team had never won three overtime games in a season until wins over Brown, Penn and Binghamton last year. UMBC had a 6-1 home record in 2007 and three of those wins have occurred in overtime. UMBC's first five home wins came by a total of seven goals. UMBC is now 9-4 in Don Zimmerman's 13-plus seasons in extra time. UMBC has the most wins and best record in the nation one-goal decisions last season at 3-0.

IN LEAGUE PLAY: UMBC is now 18-4 in its first three-plus years of America East Conference (regular season) play. They have held 18 of 22 teams to single digits in goals, although they permitted three of five AEC opponents into double digits in 2007.

40TH ANNIVERSARY: UMBC enters its 41st season of varsity men's lacrosse with an updated record of 301-253. They are 185-188 in 27 years-plus at the Division I level.

MAN UP: The Retrievers were 26 of 56 (46.4%) on the season and ended the year ranked **fifth** nationally. The Retrievers finished the season **seventh** in man-up offense in 2006 at 41.7%, **second** in 2005 at 44.4%, and **tenth** in 2004 at 37.9%. The Retrievers scored four extra man goals (10 chances) vs. Delaware and are 33.3 percent (9/27) on the young 2008 campaign. UMBC went scoreless on the man-up for the first time this season vs. Yale last Saturday.

UMBC Men's Lacrosse Game Notes

DANES TABBED: The University at Albany, winners of four of the last five league titles, received a total of 25 points and is the unanimous choice to capture the conference championship again, as voted on by the league's head coaches in the 2008 America East Men's Lacrosse Preseason Coaches' Poll. The Great Danes received five first-place votes, while **UMBC** garnered one first-place vote and 19 points. Binghamton University was tabbed third with 17 points, while Stony Brook University was picked to finish fourth with 14 points. University of Vermont and University of Hartford round out the six-team poll with eight and seven points, respectively.

PLAYER NOTES

Terry Kimener has the second-most points of any midfielder entering the 2008 campaign. His 89 points trailed only Johns Hopkins' Paul Rabil (118). Kimener just became 24th player in school history to hit the 100-point plateau (53 goals, 51 assists) with a career high five-goal, seven-point effort vs. Yale. He was named **America East Conference Player of the Week** for his efforts in that game and another multiple-point effort at Hopkins. Kimener had recorded a career-high four assists the previous Saturday vs. Denver and is ranked tenth (tied) in the nation in assists per game (2.0) and 19th (tied) in scoring (3.6 ppg). He just reached the 100 ground ball mark and played in his 50th career vs. Denver.

Sophomore middle **Alex Hopmann** is UMBC's leading returning goal-scorer with 20 last season. He scored his first goal of the season at Rutgers and added a goal and two assists vs. Denver. The two assists are a career best. He posted his first multiple-goal game of the season with two vs. Yale.

Goalkeeper **Jeremy Blevins** has a career record 22-13 and now has 366 career saves, already seventh on UMBC's all-time list.

The UMBC men's lacrosse team named seniors **Terry Kimener** and **Taylor Marino** and juniors **Bobby Atwell** and **Alex Hopmann** as its team captains for the 2007-08 academic year.

Sophomore attackman **Chris Jones** scored his first three collegiate goals in the win over Denver ... classmate and midfielder **Kyle Wimer** had a four-point effort with two goals and two assists vs. the Pioneers... sophomore **Maxx Davis** scored his first two collegiate goals on the big stage at Homewood Field and added two more vs. Yale... in addition to Smith's two goal effort, he recorded a team season-high six ground balls vs. the Blue Jays... freshman **Dom Scalzo** scored his first collegiate goal vs. the Bulldogs last Saturday.

College Park, Md.—The UMBC men's lacrosse team dropped an 11-7 decision to tenth-ranked Maryland in chilly conditions at Byrd Stadium. The Retrievers fall to 3-3 on the season, while the Terrapins improve to 4-2.

Junior midfielder Terry Kimener led the UMBC effort with three goals and an assist. Senior Drew Westervelt scored a goal and added a pair of assists, while sophomore midfielder Alex Hopmann notched a pair of goals.

UMBC fell behind, 2-0, but did tie the game on a late first quarter score by Hopmann and an early second quarter tally by Kimener. But the deadlock lasted less than two minutes, as Maryland would go on a 4-0 run and would eventually forge a 7-3 advantage at the half.

The Terrapins outscored UMBC, 4-0 in the third quarter, but the Retrievers continued to fight and turned the tables, scoring four unanswered goals in the fourth. Westervelt made it 11-7 on a goal with 2:02 to play and UMBC had an extra-man opportunity, but two Retriever attempts were saved and the Terps won their eighth straight game over UMBC.

Shots in the game were even at 29-all, as UMBC enjoyed a 15-3 margin in the fourth period. UMBC sophomore netminder Jeremy Blevins made 10 saves in 60 minutes of action. The Retrievers won 12 of 20 draws, with all the wins credited to junior Taylor Marino.

College Park, Md.—The UMBC men's lacrosse team stunned seventh-seeded Maryland, 13-9 to advance to the quarter-final round of the NCAA Men's Lacrosse Tournament. Freshman attackman Cayle Ratcliffe scored a game-high four goals and sophomore netminder Jeremy Blevins turned away a career-high 18 Terrapin shots as UMBC erased a 3-0 first quarter deficit to record their first NCAA Tournament Division I win in four tries.

Trailing 4-2 early in the second quarter, UMBC outscored the Terrapins, 9-1 in a span of 27:49 to take a 11-5 advantage after three quarters. The Terrapins drew within 12-8 with 7:34 remaining, but Ratcliffe's fourth goal of the game after a Josh Porcell feed with 6:28 remaining restored a five-goal lead. The Terps answered 14 seconds later, but would not score again as Blevins made six fourth-quarter saves.

The Retrievers fell behind, 3-0, but Retriever attackmen Drew Westervelt and Cayle Ratcliffe closed the quarter with unassisted tallies to bring the Retrievers to within 3-2 after 15 minutes. After Maryland's Dan Groot scored the first goal of the second quarter, the Retriever attack struck again, as Andy Gallagher and Westervelt scored in a 49-second span to tie the game at four-all. The Retrievers would take their first lead as Josh Porcell scored from the perimeter after a Gallagher feed at the 8:30 mark. Maryland's Max Ritz would tie the game on an extra-man goal, but senior midfielder P.J. Kimener restored the Retrievers' lead on an unassisted score with 1:37 remaining in the half. Then, 29 seconds later, Ratcliffe charged in and posted his second goal of the half to give the visitors a 7-5 advantage at intermission.

UMBC outscored Maryland, 4-0 in the third quarter and has outscored its opponents, 50-28 in the third stanza this season. Four Retrievers-senior attackmen Drew Westervelt and Andy Gallagher, senior midfielder Josh Porcell and sophomore midfielder Alex Hopmann scored two goals apiece, while senior middle P.J. Kimener had a goal and two assists.
