RETRIEVER UPDATE: UMBC begins the second year of the Phil Stern era when they host Penn in the opening round of the inaugural Retriever Tip-Off Tourney. In Stern's first season with the Retrievers he led the team to the NEC title game, taking UMBC women's hoops to its first-ever conference championship game. The Retrievers, who were a win away from advancing to the NCAA Tournament, posted a 14-16 record. With no starters returning, the Retrievers will be looking for players to step up and fill different roles as UMBC heads into their first year of the America East Conference.

PENN UPDATE: Penn returns four starters and 11 letterwinners from last year's squad that tied for second in in the Ivy League. Among the returnees that finished the 2002-03 campaign with a 15-12 record is Jewel Clark, who record 19.2 ppg and 9.5 rpg last year, and Karen Habrukowich who played in 27 games averaging 13.2 ppg. Penn was picked second in the preseason IVY League poll.

Who's Up Next: The Retrievers play either Iona or Delaware State depending on the two outcomes from opening round action. The consolation game will be played at 2 p.m. followed by the championship game slated for a 4 p.m. start.

Phil Stern has developed a reputation as a coach who takes struggling programs and skyrockets them to the top of their conference. In his first season at UMBC in 2002-03, he certainly did not disappoint. Last season, Stern led the Retrievers to their first ever conference championship game, just a year after the team failed to even qualify for the eight-team tournament. Stern's squad, after learning his system of play, made great strides, finishing the season ranked as one of the top ball handling and defensive teams in the country. The Retrievers ranked third in the NCAA last season in turnovers per game (12.1) compared to 48th in 2001-02 and finished last year 10th overall in scoring defense (55.2 ppg) in the NCAA as opposed to 32nd in 2001-02. Stern's recent success does not just date back to last season as Stern, prior to his arrival at UMBC, spent four seasons at the University of South Carolina-Aiken (Division II), where he revitalized a floundering program, going 64-47 with the Lady Pacers and earning WBCA District III Coach of the Year while taking his squad to the NCAA Division II Tournament.

Kicking 2003-04 Campaign Off Retriever Style...

The Retrievers begin their 2003-04 season with the inaugural Retriever Tip-Off Tourney on Nov. 22 and 23rd. UMBC welcomes the University of Pennsylvania, who they will meet in the first round, Delaware State and Iona. The Retrievers are an all-time 12-23 in their season opener and 7-10 since joining Division I in 1986-87. UMBC holds a home opening record of 20-15 and 13-4 since earning D-I status. Amongst the tournament's other competitors, UMBC holds a combined 3-9 all-time record (Penn (0-1), Delaware State (2-7), Iona (1-1), and have beat Delaware State and Iona in each of their last meetings. Following the championship game an all-tournament team will be selected with a tournament MVP and trophies to the championship and runner-up teams.

Phil Stern Era Moves Into Second Season...

Head coach Phil Stern will be begin the second season in his tenure at the helm of the Retriever women's hoops pro-

gram. Stern in his first season took the Retrievers to the conference title game for the first-time ever and posted a 14-16 record. Stern, known to revitalize struggling programs, continues to build for the future, bringing in six newcomers this year and signing three to National Letters of Intent for the 2004-05 campaign.

Starting From Scratch...

With the departure of all-five starters from last year's squad, Phil Stern will be looking for players to step up into the starting roll this year. Out of the six returning players, the Retrievers have a total of 26 starts combined, an average of 4.33 starts per player. Matea Pender returns with the most total starts after earning the nod in 18 games her freshman year in 2001-02 before sitting out last season with a knee injury. Anastasia Goncharova has the most starts under head coach Phil Stern with four last year in 27 games played.

Retrievers' Adding Upperclassmen Leadership...

Among the newcomers this year will be the addition of two-year college transfers Betsy Butterick and Katie Tedder, both bringing collegiate experience and leadership to a young Retriever squad. Butterick is a sophomore from Foothill College where she averaged 14.0 ppg her freshman year. Tedder, a junior, earned second team All-Jayhawk conference last year with 12.3 ppg and 6.8 rpg with Hutchinson Community College. In her two years, Tedder scored 700 points leading her squads to a combined 47-17 record.

Rookies Coming To Play...

Among the six new faces that UMBC will be sporting this season will be four freshmen, all looking to be impact players in their initial season in the black and gold. Courtney Doughman, 5'8", spent her final season at South Webster where she led her squad to a perfect 20-0 regular-season record. Brittnie Hughes, 5'7", averaged 16.0 ppg and 3.5 apg in her final year with Northside High School in Virginia. Hughes earned all-district, all-region and all-state her senior year. Heather Luttrell, 5'11", scored over 1,000 career points in her tenure at Northwestern High School in Indiana. Sharri Rohde, 5'11", the Retrievers other recruit from Indiana, was an all-county and all-conference selection and holds a single-game highs of 36 points and 16 rebounds.

Retrievers New Beast In The America East...

The Retrievers will make their first appearance in the America East this season as UMBC moves into the conference will all its 20-intercollegiate sports. Prior to this year, UMBC spent five seasons in the Northeast Conference and six in the Big South Conference. At the end of last season, the America East had a Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) of 23 compared to 31 held by the NEC (second lowest).

Going Global...

The Retrievers' 12-player roster contains three international players. The team's lone senior is Mariana Santos is from Brazil while sophomore Matea Pender is a native of Croatia and junior Anastasia Goncharova is from Russia. In addition to players from the around the world, the majority of UMBC's squad is from outside the state lines. Maria Brown (Frederick, Md.) and Tyecia Powell (Baltimore, Md.) are the Retrievers' women's hoops lone Maryland natives.

Leaders Of The Pack...UMBC head coach Phil Stern announced that junior Tyecia Powell and Sophomore Betsy Butterick will be the captains for the 2003-04 season.

UMBC Picked 10th in Preseason Conference Poll...UMBC was picked to finish in last place in the preseason conference polled release by the America East Conference. Maine was a unanimous pick for the top spot receiving nine first place votes. The Boston University was selected second followed by Vermont. UMBC, who is entering their first season in the AEC, did not place anyone on the preseason all-conference team.
