Phil Stern Enters Third Season With Retrievers... Over the past eight years, head women's basketball coach Phil Stern has seen the growing pains of revitalizing struggling programs, while at the same token he has reaped the benefits and carrying a team to the top of their respective conferences. With the Retrievers heading into their second year in the Mid-Major America East Conference and Stern entering his third year at the helm of the Retrievers, Stern will once again be facing the obstacles he has overcome before as he continues to set the foundation on sending the Retrievers' Women's Basketball program to the top ranks of their conference.

Off On The Right Foot...UMBC will look to get off on the right foot and break a streak of five losses when opening the season with a tournament. UMBC all-time is 12-24 in their season opening match, winning their last opener in 2002-03 against Towson on Nov. 23.

Long-Time No See Neighbor...Coppin State is the Retrievers closest neighbor as their campus hails less than seven miles from UMBC, yet the two programs have not went head-to-head since 1992. Coppin State has won the last three meetings. UMBC and Coppin State have met on 14 occasions with the Retrievers holding a 9-5 advantage all-time.

Home Sweet Home...The Retrievers for the first time in their 36 seasons have 15 home games as UMBC welcomes six non-conference opponents and all-nine America East foes to RAC Arena in 2004-05. The

Retrievers best home mark was a 10-0 mark at RAC Arena in 1993-94. UMBC's career home record is 184-142 (.564).

No Charity Allowed...Over the last two seasons Head Coach Phil Stern's squads ranked in the top-five in the country in fewest fouls per game. Last year the Retrievers as a team finished second nationally at 13.3 fouls per game. UMBC finished fifth in the nation two years ago in fouls per game at 13.5.

Newcomers Debut: The Retrievers opener will be the debut of four UMBC freshmen. The game marks the first collegiate game for Kristin Drabyn (Avon, Ind.), Jennifer Ferguson (Fremont, Ind.), Morgan Hatten (Potomac, Md.) and Amanda Robinson (Lusby, Md.).

Doughman Set UMBC Individual Single-Season Three-Point Field Goal Percentage in 2003-04...Sophomore Courtney Doughman set UMBC's top single-season three-point field percentage in 2003-04 when she connected on 45 of 109 attempts from beyond the arc for a .413 shooting percentage. The next best percentage his held by Jami Lange, .380, set in 1998-99.

Retrievers Set AE Single-Season Three-Point Field Goals Mark In Opening Season...The Retrievers in their first year in the America East Conference became the new single-season leader for made three-point baskets in a season. The Retrievers connected on 194 three-point baskets on the year as Anastasia Goncharova hit 70 of those made treys to lead UMBC. The

Retrievers Become AE Single-Season Three-Point Field Goals Attempted Leader...UMBC eclipsed the America East single-season record for three-point field goals attempted, set by New Hampshire in 2001-02 with 526 attempts. The Retrievers entered their game on Mar. 2 against Vermont with 525 attempts on the season and took 17 shots from outside the arc to set the new mark. The Retrievers finished the year 578 three-point field goal attempts.

Retrievers Break Single-Game Marks From Outside The Arc...The Retrievers produced stellar numbers in the first meeting with Northeastern last year as they set a number of new team single-game marks. The Retrievers' 14 three-point baskets made against Northeastern ties for second in the America East record books and is a UMBC record. In addition, the Retrievers set school records for field goal percentage at 67.4 percent (31-of-46) and three-point field goal percentage at 63.6 (14-of-22).

Retrievers Finish 2003-04 In Top-Two In All-Three AE Conference Games Shooting Charts...The Retrievers hit their stride putting the ball in the hoop once the conference season began, finishing the year ranking in AE conference games only in the top-two for the three shooting categories (field goal %, 3-pt field goal %, free throw %). As a team the Retrievers led the conference in league games in field goal percentage, finishing first after shooting 43.9 percent from the field. The Retrievers ranked second in league games in three-point field goal percentage (37.9 percent) and free throw percentage (78.1 percent).

Hitting The Airwaves...With the newly launched umbcretrievers.com, the majority of home games and a few road contests will be broadcast live on the internet through www.umbcretrievers.com. Umbcretrievers.com will also broadcast live stats for all men's and women's basketball home games.
